The volunteer State Duty Officer (SDO) role is fundamental to the delivery of Surf Emergency Response System and joint operations between SLSNSW and other emergency services.

Formalised in January 2008, the Surf Emergency Response System is delivered by the small team of highly experienced SDOs and State Operations Centre Staff who support all SLS/ALS and Council Lifeguard Services in NSW. Since its inception the system has coordinated over 2,700 emergency incidents (mostly at unpatrolled locations/times), resulting in over 1,000 rescues/lives saved.

On average, a SDO is expected to be available for at least 4 shifts per month. SDOs are required to be 100% contactable and able to fulfill the SDO function at all times while on shift (as either 'primary' or 'back-up' SDO).

Suitable candidates will be required to undertake additional training and commence operations in a probationary/mentored capacity initially.

State Duty Officers are appointed by the Board of SLSNSW.
