# OUR MISSION

To save lives, create great Australians  
and build better communities.

Today, Surf Life Saving NSW (SLSNSW) has members across 129 Surf Life Saving Clubs (SLSCs) and 11 branches who perform thousands of rescues, preventative actions and first aid treatments each year.

The origins of Surf Life Saving can be traced back to the actions of Mr William Gocher who, in September 1902 at Manly Beach, defied the law of the time by bathing during the prohibited daylight hours. As the popularity of surf bathing quickly grew into a national pastime, its dangers became apparent.

Small groups of experienced, regular surfers began to form themselves into lifesaving bodies to help people who needed rescuing from an unfamiliar environment.

As these lifesaving bodies or 'clubs' grew in size and number, the need for a united front to raise money and ask for help from local councils and the NSW Government was identified and the NSW Surf Bathing Association was formed on 18 October 1907. The name of the Association was later changed to the Surf Life Saving Association of Australia, and in 1991 it was changed again to Surf Life Saving Australia.

Surf Life Saving NSW, formerly known as the Surf Life Saving Association of Australia (NSW State Centre) has operated within the state boundaries of NSW to fulfil the mission and goals of the Association since 1907.

Since recording began in 1949 our members have performed in excess of 362,000 rescues.

# MINISTER'S FOREWORD

“On behalf of the NSW Government I would like to thank you for volunteering your time to protect beachgoers in NSW”



I am delighted to write the foreword for the 109th Annual Report of Surf Life Saving New South Wales (SLSNSW).

This season was another busy one for lifesavers with more than 6,000 rescues and 157,000 preventative actions taken, along with 14,000 first aid treatments.

Tragically there were 53 coastal drowning deaths this year which is the highest number of drownings in recent memory. These deaths occurred outside the red and yellow flags, which highlights the valuable role lifesavers play in protecting the community and the importance of the general public swimming at patrolled beaches.

The Surf Rescue Emergency Response System has continued to respond to emergency callouts with 735 calls from NSW Police this year. The number of incidents increased 45% on the last year with the number of rescues carried out through this service also increasing 47%. The NSW Ambulance was tasked to beaches 585 times, further demonstrating the vital relationship between SLSNSW and other emergency service providers.

Through the NSW Department of Justice, the NSW Government continued to support SLSNSW programs and operations with a recommitment of funding to the NSW Water Safety Black Spots Funding program for the Surf School Project (Year 3) and Project Blueprint (Year 4).

In the third year of the Surf School Project, 3,500 students from Western Sydney high schools were taught surf safety education and received practical education. In the fourth year of Project Blueprint, the coastal public risk assessments continued to take place across the state with the final 29 Local Council and National Park areas completed. This data will be instrumental in addressing the rate of coastal drownings in NSW and is already being utilised to assist the NSW Government identify areas for mandatory lifejacket use.

On behalf of the NSW Government I would like to thank you for volunteering your time to protect beachgoers in NSW and to congratulate the organisation on its efforts to educate the community away from the coast with its Wet'n'Wild Nippers program, the Surf School Project in Western Sydney and the Beach to Bush program.

# PRESIDENT'S REPORT

I'm proud to share with you some of the achievements detailed here in the Annual Report for Surf Life Saving NSW for 2015-16.

In my final year as President of this great organisation, I firstly want to sincerely thank all our volunteers and lifesavers who once again ensured there were no lives lost between the red and yellow flags.

It is a privilege to be able to reflect on the enormous achievements and improvements which have been made during the last eight years and the esteemed position Surf Life Saving holds in the eyes of the NSW community.

As always, we are extremely grateful for the support of the NSW Government and the various departments and agencies with whom we interact or have partnered with on important public safety projects. Thanks also to our major sponsors, in particular ClubsNSW and Stramit Building Products and to our partners at the national level, DHL and Westpac.

There are so many success stories from across the organisation, at local club level right through to state-wide initiatives which are helping save lives beyond the flags.

I'm particularly proud of the ongoing development of our Surf Emergency Response System and want to thank our hard-working Duty Officers, support services and State Operations Centre volunteers and staff who responded to 650 emergency callouts throughout the year, an increase of 29% from the previous year.

It has been extremely rewarding to have witnessed the achievement of a number of milestones and major new initiatives during my tenure as president. Some of these include:

- Consolidating the Surf Life Saving NSW headquarters activities at Belrose in 2010 and the establishment of a dedicated State Operations Centre to coordinate communications and lifesaving assets across NSW.

- Securing funding for and constructing the Northern Operations Centre in Port Macquarie, opened in 2015, which is an important regional hub to support our volunteers throughout the north of the state.
- The growth and extension of services provided by our professional lifeguard arm through the Australian Lifeguard Service, delivering expert public safety services to coastal LGAs and additional pathways to our members.

None of these achievements could have been realised without the skill and commitment of both our elected executive team and the staff of Surf Life Saving NSW. In particular I want to thank CEO Phil Vanny AM for his leadership and vision over the last 16 years.

Phil's accomplishments are many, from spearheading the establishment of the Australian Lifesaving Academy in 2004, establishing the Emergency Response System in 2008, to lobbying the NSW Government to change legislation to the Liquor Act, allowing our clubs to be self-sufficient and generate their own funding. Following many years of negotiations, an historic agreement was reached with the NSW Government to secure standard lease arrangements for surf clubs on Crown Land in January 2016.

There is no doubt the strength of the organisation financially and operationally is in large part due to the expertise and stakeholder engagement skills Phil Vanny has brought to Surf Life Saving NSW. Throughout Phil's tenure, more funding has been distributed to clubs and branches than ever before with a 2321% increase in direct financial distributions to these entities.

To my fellow Directors, Advisors and Branch Presidents, thank you for your support. After six years' service as Director of Surf Sport, Michael Bate chose to step down from the role and I thank him for bringing his extensive leadership and management skills to improving our competition processes and development programs.

I would also like to acknowledge the significant and sustained contribution for more than a decade of our Director of Lifesaving, John Restuccia. Together with the broader lifesaving team, John has expertly steered the strategic direction of our operations and it has been a pleasure to watch the great strides we have made in improving public safety in the aquatic environment.

It is exciting to see the scope of our activities continue to evolve. Exploring new technologies and innovations such as Unmanned Aerial Vehicles have the potential to extend our surveillance, search and rescue capabilities beyond belief.

These innovations, along with the continued upgrading and enhancement of the capabilities of our volunteers through the efforts of our Trainers, Assessors and Facilitators, makes me certain the future of Surf Life Saving is in good hands.

# CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT

This season saw the NSW Parliamentary Friends of Surf Life Saving launch the Surf Life Saving NSW report on ‘The Value of Surf Life Saving NSW to the community’. This report found that for every dollar invested in Surf Life Saving in NSW, there is a return of \$46. This benefit-cost ratio demonstrates the considerable benefits achieved for the community from Surf Life Saving activities.

The report also estimated the value of Surf Life Saving in preventing drowning deaths and permanent incapacitations to be \$1.9 billion. What is astounding though, is what would happen if volunteer lifesaving services weren't there supervising beach goers. It is estimated that in the absence of Surf Life Saving services, there would be 320 additional drowning deaths and 234 additional permanent incapacitations.

Surf Life Saving NSW continues to take a lead role as a peak water safety organisation in NSW, with the completion of one of the most significant pieces of work to prevent drowning, ‘Project Blueprint’. With funding from the NSW Government's Water Safety Black Spots Fund, Surf Life Saving NSW has carried out coastal risk assessments at every beach over the last four years. This project has involved assessing 1133 locations (beaches and rock platforms) in NSW, which has been incorporated into mapping systems.

This year, Surf Life Saving NSW was able to provide the government with unique insights into high risk locations along the NSW coast with data obtained through Project Blueprint. The introduction of legislation mandating the use of lifejackets at high risk locations along the NSW coast is expected to save many people's lives. Tragically, this season saw 10 drowning deaths attributed to rock fishing, with the common factor across all fatalities being that not one victim was wearing a lifejacket.

The 2015-16 season saw a landmark agreement for Surf Life Saving Clubs with the Minister for Primary Industries, Niall Blair MLC announcing the release of a standardised lease agreement for SLSCs on Crown Land. This is a significant milestone in the history of our organisation, which sees clubs being offered a 20 year lease term and minimum rent in recognition of the service they provide to the community across the state.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the NSW Government for committing another \$2 million in funding under the Surf Club Facility Grant program, which to date has resulted in \$22 million in funding being distributed to surf clubs. I would also like to thank the Premier and Minister Elliott for reinstating the Water Safety Black Spots Fund next year and for their commitment to provide funding to Surf Life Saving NSW to enhance our rescue capabilities over the next three years. My thanks also goes to Melinda Pavey, the Chairperson of the NSW Parliamentary Friends of Surf Life Saving for her ongoing enthusiasm and support for our activities.

On behalf of the membership and the staff, I would like to thank Tony Haven AM for his leadership and support as President over the last eight years and also Michael Bate for his business acumen and contribution to sport over the last six years as the Director of Surf Sports.

Finally, thank you to all our partners, in particular ClubsNSW and Stramit for their support and thank you to all our members for keeping our beaches safe.

# GOVERNANCE

## State Council

The State Council of Surf Life Saving NSW (SLSNSW) consists of 11 Branch Presidents.

### Duties

- Elect the Directors
- Inform the Board of significant issues affecting the membership
- Assist the Board design and review SLSNSW’s strategic direction
- Discuss State-wide issues
- Approve any amendments to the Constitution
- Provide feedback to the Board on the results of its governance decisions in practice at the member level.
- Meets formally twice per year.

The AGM is to be held within the period of six months after the end of the financial year, but is usually held in November.

The Election State Council Meeting is held preferably in May.

## Board of Directors

President, Deputy President, Director of Finance, Director of Lifesaving, Director of Education, Director of Surf Sports and Director of Member Services.

### Duties

- Oversee SLSNSW’s strategic direction and priorities
- Interact with key stakeholders to inform them of achievements and ensuring that they have input into determining strategic goals and direction
- Regularly scanning the external operating environment to ensure that SLSNSW’s strategic direction remains both appropriate and achievable
- Monitor organisational performance and evaluate strategic results
- Ensure financial viability and security of SLSNSW by setting financial governance policies
- Report back to the stakeholders at the AGM
- In accordance with the SLSNSW Strategic Plan, establish the policy framework for governing SLSNSW, from which all operational policies and actions are developed
- Evaluate its effectiveness as a Board of Directors
- Appoint committees, panels, advisers to carry out aspects of their work
- Meets as often as is deemed necessary in every calendar year.

### Rotating 2 year terms for Directors

- President, Director of Finance, Director of Education and Director of Surf Sports shall be elected in each year of even number
- Deputy President, Director of Lifesaving and Director of Members Services shall be elected in each year of odd number

## Advisers

As soon as practical after the Election State Council Meeting, the Board may appoint:

- A Lifesaving Adviser
- An Education Adviser
- A Surf Sports Adviser
- A Member Services Adviser
- Or any other Adviser that the SLSNSW Board may consider necessary from time to time and whom need not be members

### Role of Advisers

The SLSNSW advisory positions oversee and advise in speciality areas of surf lifesaving, such as surf sports, coaching, education, medical and health.

### Duties

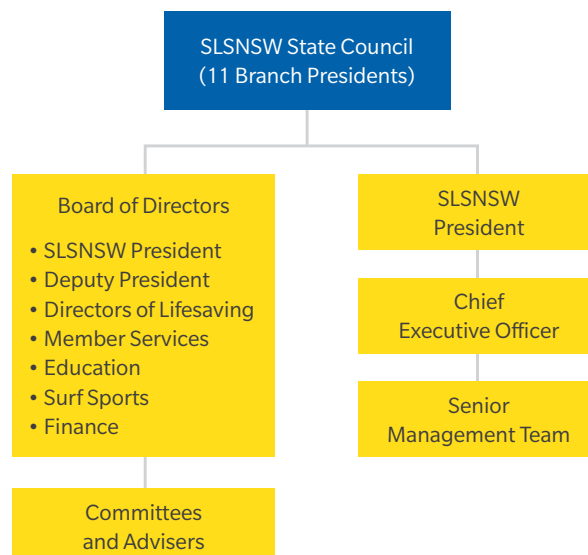
- May be required to attend State Council Meetings (without the right to vote)

# LIFESAVING SERVICES

“We’re pleased there were again no drownings between the red and yellow flags.”

The 2015-16 season was a challenging one, with many different scenarios being put to surf lifesavers who once again did an outstanding job. Some of the issues faced were state-wide like the amount of marine stings which drove up first aid treatments, and the warmer months of February and March which increased beach attendance to over 6.8 million people for the season. There was an increase in emergency response taskings to shark sightings in Northern NSW and to remote areas on the coast like Figure Eight Pools in the Royal National Park.

Unfortunately, the drowning toll for the 2015-16 season was 53 which is the highest in many years, significantly up on the previous year (37). The 10 year average for coastal drownings is 39. We’re pleased there were again no drownings between the red and yellow flags. Over half of the drownings (27) occurred further than 1km from any lifesaving service, and close to 58% of the total drownings were outside patrol hours at the time of the incident.

## Lifesaving Operations & Programs

Throughout the 2015-16 season, the Lifesaving team at Surf Life Saving NSW were highly focused on reducing volunteer time by making processes as efficient as possible. This will continue as we strive to be an effective innovative service. Some highlights were:

- Patrol Ops app for sign on and sign off becoming more accessible
- Webinar training for SurfCom Operators
- Streamlined the process for the \$300,000 Lifesaving Equipment grant, saving Branches time and Clubs money through bulk purchasing – total equipment value \$460,000
- GPS tracking of radios through the update to software in the State Operation Centre
- Successful trials of Emergency Response Beacon in remote patrolling and blackspot locations

SLSNSW has continued to support branches and clubs with core lifesaving equipment. More than \$300,000 worth of frontline lifesaving equipment was granted to clubs, another \$57,000 was provided to branches to assist them with operational costs associated with their Support Operations initiatives.

The Rescue of the Month recognition program is proving very popular among clubs with a total of 40 nominations for outstanding and deserving rescues received during the year. At a national level, New South Wales clubs continue to be recognised, winning National Rescue of the Month for 8 of the 10 nomination periods. Congratulations to Macksville-Scotts Head SLSC who were awarded Rescue of the Year at the 2016 Awards of Excellence.

The Beyond My Club 26+ Development Program was held in June for the second year with resounding success due to the high number of applicants. Feedback surrounding the program was positive with the participants enhancing their knowledge of Surf Life Saving and broadening their perceptions on challenging issues that face clubs by sharing knowledge, ideas and initiatives with other passionate members.

The Lifesaving Exchange Program was held over the Australia Day Long Weekend (23-26 January 2016) with 19 members from 16 clubs participating. The program is in its eighth season with 156 members aged between 18 and 25 participating since inception.

The New Zealand Lifesaving Exchange Program has operated since 2010 and provides participants with a unique opportunity to develop and share their experiences at an international level. Darren Moses (Dixon Park SLSC) and Jessica Thomas (Umina SLSC) represented SLSNSW during this year’s New Zealand Lifesaving Exchange Program.

## Emergency Response and Communications

The Surf Emergency Response System had another big year with 735 calls received from NSW Police which were fielded by the team of State Duty Officers. Branch Duty Officers and club callout teams responded to 650 of those 735 calls, which is a massive effort. The team of SurfCom Operators had a busy year dispatching 591 ambulances to incidents and completing over 3,000 volunteer hours assisting the volunteer lifesavers on the beach.

The Surf Life Saving Coastal Radio Network continues to play a vital part in surf lifesaving operations and the network has undergone some major enhancements over the past 12 months. We installed a Digital Radio Network in the Mid North Coast Branch and upgraded five other sites in the state; we commissioned four reports for other branches to progress with digital upgrades in the coming years.

Continued thanks must go to our partners at NSW Police Marine Area Command, Police Radio (communications) and Polair. Their ongoing professional support and partnership is making a major difference to our ability to quickly respond to emergencies and save more lives along the NSW coastline.

We thank all our other partners and supporters, Marine Rescue NSW, Department of Primary Industries, Australian Lifeguard Service, other council lifeguard services, Westpac Lifesaver Rescue Helicopter, NSW Ambulance Service and other rescue helicopter services. Working together, we are now able to ensure the closest, most appropriate lifesaving services are notified and are equipped to respond to emergencies more effectively. We look forward to working with these agencies in the future.

Thanks must go to the 11 Branch Directors of Lifesaving and your teams for their hard work and continued support and collaboration, thanks also to the SurfCom, State Duty Officers and Powercraft Advisors. Lastly and most importantly we thank all our volunteers on the ground, with the sand between their toes for their continued dedication and commitment to preventing drowning and injury on NSW beaches and we look forward to supporting you again in the 2016-17 season.

# AUSTRALIAN LIFEGUARD SERVICE (NSW)

It is with pleasure that I present the Australian Lifeguard Service NSW (ALS NSW) Annual Report for the provision of professional lifeguard services during the 2015-16 season. The past 12 months have seen the ALS NSW continue to make significant changes and innovations in the way we operate across NSW and it is with pride that I outline some of these advancements below.

## Contracts and Service Partners

The past year has seen the ALS NSW retain contracts with Greater Taree City Council, Port Stephens Council and Parramatta City Council. A noticeable achievement and significant gain for water safety in NSW was the extension of service in the Port Stephens LGA where the ALS provides seven month patrol coverage with the assistance of a Rescue Water Craft (RWC) at each service location. This service has now set the standard for other services throughout the state.

The 2015-16 season saw the ALS NSW continue to extend patrol services in conjunction with our contracted partners. Extensions were delivered in Ballina Shire, Parramatta City and Bega Valley Shire LGAs, as well as with Tweed Coast Holiday Parks. It is pleasing to see our partners recognising the value of the service we provide to their communities and continuing to work with us to achieve one of our key strategic objectives – reducing coastal drownings in NSW.

The ALS NSW once again conducted a survey of our contracted partners following the 2015-16 season to gather feedback on the services we provide. A key finding from this survey was that all contract partners would highly recommend, or recommend our services to other councils or regulatory bodies. This is an outstanding result and reflects the high benchmark of service the ALS NSW is committed to provide its partners. The outcome of this survey confirms that the ALS NSW goals are consistently being met.

The ALS NSW thanks all our council and other contract partners for recognising the importance of providing quality professional lifeguard services to their local communities and visitors. The ALS NSW looks forward to continuing to provide a high level of service to all our contract partners, a number of which have now been in operation for over 29 years.

## Improved Communications

In 2015-16 the ALS NSW led a national project to develop a new ALS website that provides both our lifeguard staff and potential business partners with a simple, fresh and easy-to-use online experience. We demonstrated that by working together with our state ALS counterparts, we were able to produce a website that reflects the professional breadth of each state's individual business. The feedback received from our lifeguard staff, industry partners and potential business partners is that this website is something that we can be proud of and is reflective of the professional nature of the ALS throughout Australia.



## Lifeguard Operations

Lifeguards across NSW during the 2015-16 season were kept busy and were required to deal with a variety of challenging conditions. The season saw more than 4.13 million people visit our patrolled locations. Throughout the season 321 employed lifeguards performed approximately 76,700 patrol hours, conducted 830 rescues, more than 254,000 preventative actions and 6460 first aid treatments.

The ALS NSW prides itself on being proactive rather than reactive and the strongest indicator of this was once again the high number of preventative actions that were undertaken by lifeguards. These actions meant that lifeguards performed 50 less rescues over the course of the season. The professionalism that our lifeguards continue to exhibit and the enthusiasm they show for the job means the public can confidently rely on the highest level of service and safety when enjoying the beach.

The ALS NSW continues to play a leading role in the 24-hour surf emergency callout system, working closely alongside volunteer surf lifesavers and strategically located Westpac Life Saver Rescue Helicopter Services. The ALS NSW has also been proactive in working with the SLSNSW Lifesaving team and the Department of Primary Industries to support the NSW Government-funded Shark Management Strategy.

Once more the ALS NSW thanks all our contract partners, SLSNSW branches and clubs for their ongoing support. We look forward to continuing to build on these strong relationships and the foundation that has been forged over numerous seasons.

# AUSTRALIAN COASTSAFE (NSW)

## Australian CoastSafe (NSW)

Since 2012, SLSNSW through Australian CoastSafe has been working on Project Blueprint, assessing and reporting on every accessible beach and rock platform in each of the 30<sup>1</sup> coastal Local Government Areas (LGA) in NSW. This year marks the end of the four-year project where an overall 1736km of coastline comprising 1133 beaches and rock platforms were assessed. In the final year assessments were provided to local, regional and state land management authorities covering the LGAs of Great Lakes, Greater Taree, Kempsey, Lake Macquarie, Newcastle, Port Macquarie and Port Stephens. In addition to Project Blueprint, services were also provided in non-coastal environments and internationally.

## CoastSafe contributes toward the following strategic goals of SLSNSW:

- To reduce the rate of drowning in New South Wales.
- To extend lifesaving coverage to match community needs and the expectation of all stakeholders.
- To ensure we remain the recognised peak body for beach and coastal public safety.
- To enhance our relationship with all levels of government to promote the value of the organisation.
- To be adaptive, flexible and move with change.



## Project Blueprint

The project commenced in 2012 with funding support from the NSW Ministry for Police and Emergency Services through the Water Safety Black Spots Fund and was completed in June 2016. Coastal public safety risk assessments identify gaps in the International Life Saving Federation's drowning prevention framework and prioritise drowning prevention strategies based on evidence and consultation.

As at 30 June 2016, there have been 459 coastal drowning deaths in NSW since 1 July 2004. An average of 38 people drown in coastal waters every year in NSW accounting for almost 40% of the national coastal drowning toll<sup>2</sup>.

Rock fishing continues to be over represented in NSW drowning statistics. This year, SLSNSW has assisted the NSW Government with efforts to introduce legislation to mandate the use of lifejackets for people rock fishing in high risk locations. Project Blueprint has provided the government with unique insights supported by the data from the project. The introduction of legislation mandating the use of lifejackets at high risk locations along the NSW coast is expected to save lives and reduce the exposure to unnecessary risk for surf lifesavers responding to search or recovery efforts.

Over the four years of this project we have worked with 29 coastal councils and one State Conservation Area, comprehensively assessing 1736km of coastline. To date, 1133 locations (beaches and rock platforms) have been reported on. A vast amount of spatial data has been collected on aspects of the coast that contribute to the risk of drowning including data on 25,107 identified coastal hazards, 5779 coastal access points, 14,811 coastal signs, 355 items of rescue equipment and 14,923 coastal facilities such as picnic areas and amenities.

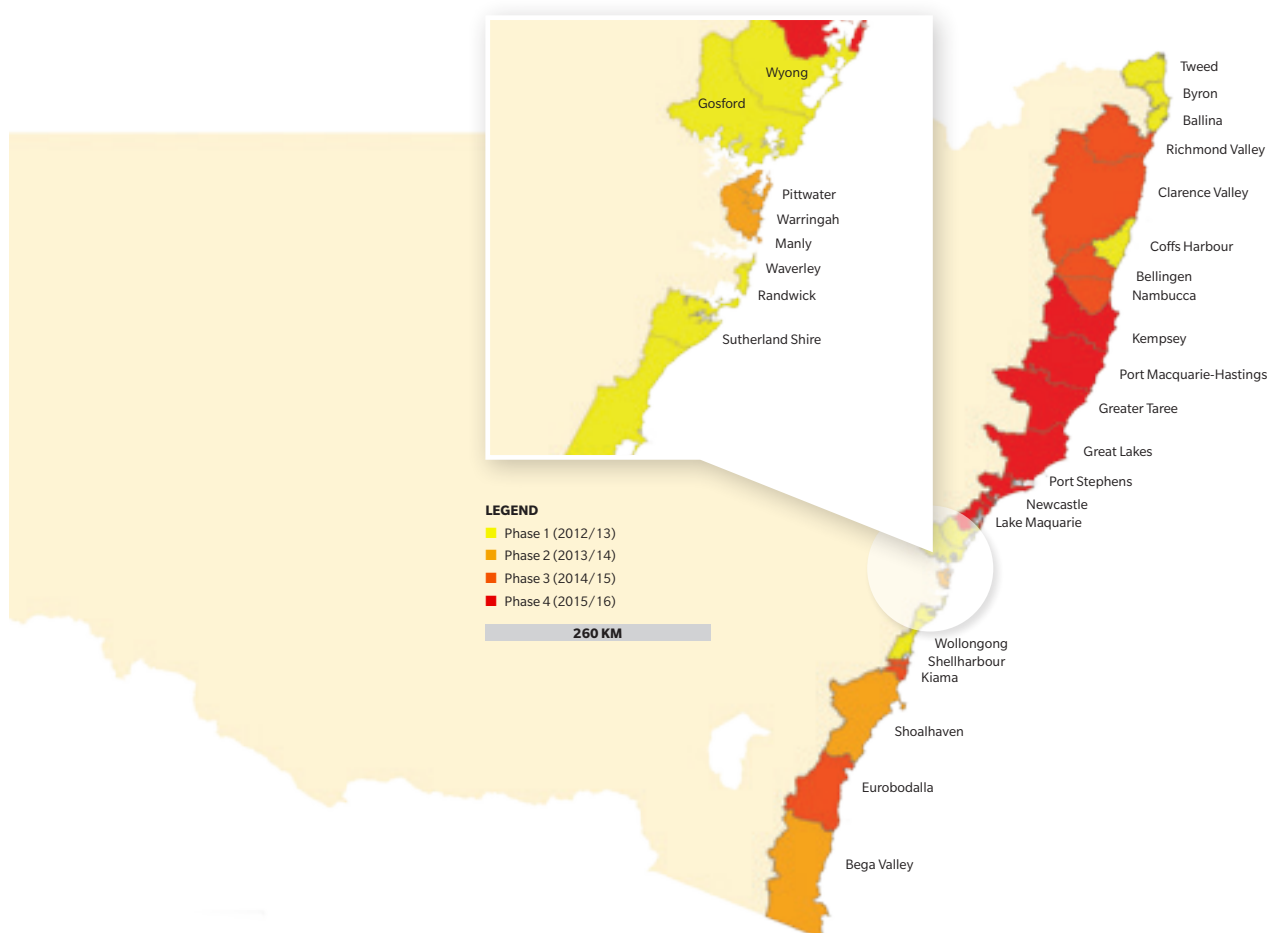
All collected data is geocoded and analysed using Geographic Information Systems (GIS) and incorporated into mapping systems for Land Managers. This data will also be used to enhance both Surf Life Saving and emergency services response and planning and will also be incorporated into the Australian Beach Safety and Management Program.

Data is presented in a manner consistent with ISO 31000:2009 Risk Management – Principles and Guidelines, providing Land Managers with a prioritised treatment plan consisting of options for implementation.

The project has increased the focus on community safety which in turn reduces the likelihood of risks and hazards going unnoticed and incidents occurring. Outcomes in addition to lives saved, include reduced duplication, reduced costs, improved joint-operations and partnerships between stakeholders and long-term sustainable and effective drowning prevention strategies.

This research has been used to deliver outcomes across all aspects of the drowning prevention framework, including:

- To support the delivery of education and awareness programs to high risk communities such as Sydney's Western suburbs.
- Modified access to improve exposure to standardised aquatic warning signage and also discourage access to extremely hazardous locations and encourage access to more suitable locations.
- Identification of inconsistent approaches to the provision of warnings by different land management authorities.
- An Emergency Marker System for coastal areas to improve emergency response.
- Efficiencies in lifeguard services across the state, including providing lifeguard services at new locations or extensions to the duration of existing patrol services.
- Auditing of existing public rescue equipment and identification of potential locations.

#### Aquatic Risk Management Services

In addition to Project Blueprint, Australian CoastSafe (NSW) also provides a 'for fee' service to land management authorities, developers, insurers, events and tourism operators. In 2015-16 we delivered our services into some non-traditional Surf Life Saving environments, such as rivers, lakes and bays. The processes and techniques developed by the CoastSafe unit over many years can easily be adapted for non-beach environments allowing communities away from the coast to benefit from Surf Life Saving NSW's knowledge and experience in drowning prevention strategies.

# AUSTRALIAN LIFESAVING ACADEMY

The Australian Lifesaving Academy NSW (ALA NSW) under the Surf Life Saving NSW Registered Training Organisation (RTO ID 90394) has provided services to the NSW and ACT community for over 12 years. The 2015-16 year was the most successful yet for the ALA NSW across both First Aid Training and Event Safety Services. The ALA NSW has now trained 374,581 course participants since its inception in 2004. This is a fantastic milestone to reach and a credit to all ALA NSW team members, both current and past.

“Transforming everyday Australians into lifesavers” remains the core mission of the ALA NSW. We strive to meet this mission through the delivery of effective first aid training, the provision of frontline first aid services and water safety at events, and through surf and water safety education programs throughout the NSW.

## First Aid Training

During the past year the ALA NSW has seen strong growth in its first aid training services. From July 2015 to June 2016 the Academy delivered 69,987 awards in comparison to July 2014 – June 2015 when 52,658 awards were delivered, which is a 32.9% increase.

Of the 69,987 total awards delivered during the period, 12,842 were Provide First Aid awards, 39,894 were CPR awards. The remaining 17,251 comprised of Education and Care First Aid, the new Department of Education (DoE) Anaphylaxis course, Emergency Care, Advanced Resuscitation, Spinal Management, Junior First Aid, Advanced First Aid, Remote Area First Aid and accredited Asthma and Anaphylaxis.

Thanks to the NSW school teacher professional development days on 17 and 18 December 2015, the ALA NSW delivered a massive 10,095 awards, which was the most training awards ever delivered by the ALA NSW in a single month.

In 2015, the NSW Department of Education (NSW DoE) identified a need for a NSW DoE Approved Provider Panel to ensure the delivery of consistently high standard first aid response training across the state. After a lengthy tender process, on 30 September 2015, the ALA NSW was appointed to the NSW DoE Approved Provider Panel for the provision of First Aid, CPR and Anaphylaxis training for all NSW DoE staff. As it is a requirement for all NSW Government schools to arrange face to face CPR and Anaphylaxis training on an annual basis, our appointment to the DoE Approved Provider Panel represents a significant growth opportunity for the ALA NSW.

The NSW DoE Approved Provider Panel agreement took effect on 1 January 2016. During the initial six months, the ALA NSW has secured an additional 73 new school clients taking our current client list to 1,406 schools across NSW. This panel arrangement will be in place for an initial term of two years with the option of three 12 month extensions.

During 2015-16 the ALA NSW made several enhancements to its public course offerings, including the addition of new course locations and a renewed marketing strategy. Due largely to these changes, the ALA NSW has secured an increase in participants of around 20% over the past 12 months.

For the 2016 calendar year the ALA NSW has booked 335 public courses at 23 locations across NSW and the ACT. One new location is the recently-opened Surf Life Saving NSW Northern Operations Centre in Port Macquarie where various courses are being offered and delivered to the local community and our Surf Life Saving members in the region. We also added a new location in Canberra due to an increasing demand for our public courses in the ACT.

Other significant developments in the ALA NSW's training operations over the past 12 months include securing training partnerships with the Department of Parliamentary Services, Valspar ANZ, UNE Partnerships Pty Ltd and Campbell Page. In December 2015 the Pacific Smiles Group confirmed it would extend its contract for CPR training across NSW, Victoria and Queensland for an additional three years (2016-2019).

From 1 January 2016, the ALA NSW was required to implement the Australian Government, Department of Industry Unique Student Identifier (USI) scheme to provide participants undertaking Vocational Education and Training (VET) with access to an online record of all the training they have completed since 1 January 2015. This information can be used when applying for a job, seeking a credit transfer or demonstrating pre-requisites when undertaking further training. Along with this new reporting requirement and in order to streamline other business processes, the ALA NSW has implemented an advanced Learner Management System called aXcelerate. It is an AVETMISS-compliant solution built for registered training organisations, with features that enable better management of student information.

In May 2016 the ALA NSW trialled an external telemarketing company, Kuchikomi, to grow the broader market and income for the ALA within the ACT schools and building and construction industry. The ACT schools campaign was very successful and delivered new opportunities within the ACT schools markets. The building and construction industry campaign was also successful and through these campaigns the ALA NSW expects to significantly improve its market share over the medium to long term.

In partnership with Laerdal the ALA NSW offered an end of financial year campaign for competitively priced HeartStart Defibrillators. Every year there are approximately 30,000 cases of sudden cardiac arrest (SCA) within Australia with the majority occurring outside a hospital setting. This was the most successful Defibrillator campaign yet, with many new Laerdal HeartStart Defibrillators provided to various organisations across NSW including schools, sports clubs, medical centres and aged care facilities.



ALA NSW milestones since inception in 2004:

- Over 110,000 First Aid certificates delivered
- Over 174,000 CPR certificates delivered
- Over 32,000 Emergency Care certificates delivered
- Over 13,000 people trained in Accredited Asthma & Anaphylaxis
- Over 9,000 (junior) school students trained in Junior First Aid and Basic Resus
- 7,723 NSW School Staff trained in the new NSW DoE Anaphylaxis course since January 2016

#### **Event Safety Services**

It has been another successful year for the Australian Event Safety Services (AESS). The AESS continues to provide aquatic rescue, first aid and risk management services to a varying client base across the state. They include schools, sporting groups, production companies, cultural, community and music festivals, as well as government organisations.

In 2015-16 overall service provision has increased by 11%, with growth in first aid services being the major contributor. Our staff were provided with ongoing training in order to develop their skill base, qualifications and to ensure they were ready to respond to any situation.

The AESS would like to thank staff, clients and surf clubs for their ongoing support during the season. The AESS looks forward to further growth in 2016-17.

The ALA and AESS continue to grow their market share and the professionalism of staff and service delivery. The significant achievements this year are a testament to the hardworking team of both full time staff as well as the large contingent of casual trainers and first responders throughout the state. I would like to take this opportunity to thank the combined ALA and AESS team for their tireless efforts during 2015-16 and we look forward to another successful year serving the Surf Life Saving and broader NSW community.

# EDUCATION

“Our Beach to Bush program continues to be very popular, delivering surf education to thousands of students living 50km or more away from the beach.”

The 2015-16 year has been another busy and exciting one for Education with a number of key projects undertaken to better support our volunteer educators and to improve the reach of our community education programs.

## Member Training

Year two of the 2014-17 Member Education work plan was implemented with a continued focus on encouraging and enabling club self-sufficiency, demystifying education policies and processes, empowering our Chief Training Officers (CTOs) to plan for development and promoting and supporting the key roles of our Trainers, Assessors and Facilitators (TAFs).

Building on the work that was completed in 2014-15 to streamline the Member Education Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) and paperwork, a new TAF re-endorsement process was launched this season. The new process adopted a more ‘commonsense’ approach to the re-endorsement requirements, as well as a streamlined online application process which was used for over 80% of all re-endorsements (or almost 550 applications).

Linked to this piece of work was a revamp of the way in which pre-season education updates and professional development is delivered to TAFs across the state. We worked closely with the Branch Directors of Education to take advantage of the face-to-face Education pre-season meetings for this purpose, directly reaching almost 370 TAFs throughout August and September 2015. For those who couldn’t make face-to-face meetings, webinar technology was trialled to deliver the essential pre-season update information. This innovation reached an additional 300 TAFs across NSW.

A grant secured through the Emergency Volunteer Support Scheme (EVSS) enabled us to pilot a new approach to the delivery of Training Officer courses in 2015-16, with three weekend courses delivered in partnership with Branches across the state. These courses delivered over 20% of new trainers during the season. The new format aimed to increase completion rates for the course as well as improve the learning experience for all new trainers.

Our key focus this season was on development planning and capacity building for CTOs. This goal has been furthered via a number of projects including:

- **Educheck** – implemented in early 2016, this new tool seeks to support development planning for CTOs in clubs. In total, 118 out of 129 clubs participated in the Educheck process, the results and outcomes of which will inform where further support can be provided by Branches and/or SLSNSW.
- **Club Sustainability** – key sustainability indicators for Education were determined and included in the Club Sustainability Reports to provide objective data for clubs to build their action plans around (see Member Services section).

- **CTO Induction** – a hard copy written resource plus supporting video material was developed this season to better support new CTOs get to grips with their role. These new materials will be used in the 2016-17 season.
- **CTO Conference** – the third triennial CTO Conference was held in July 2016. The conference theme ‘Rising Tide’, focused on how excellence in the CTO role can help to lift the performance of the whole club, ensuring its growth, sustainability and relevance into the future.

One of the member-focused projects delivered this season was a key milestone for the organisation, with our Registered Training Organisation (RTO) status renewal in March 2016. Thanks in part to the ongoing commitment to continuous improvement demonstrated by all of our volunteers and staff, our status as a RTO was secured until 30 March 2023.

Finally, a number of national initiatives were launched this season which impacted on member education, including the launch of the 8th Edition Powercraft Manual and revised IRB/RWC learning and assessment resources, as well as changes to the skills maintenance process aimed at reducing the burden on assessors and administrators during the first half of the season.

During what was another busy year for all involved in Member Education, we delivered more Bronze Medallion, IRB Crew, IRB Driver and Beach Management awards compared to the 2014-15 season. A huge thank you as always to the ongoing enthusiasm and dedication of the volunteers who manage and support this portfolio in NSW Clubs and Branches.

## Community Education

The 2015-16 year was a pivotal one for Community Education. As well as the ongoing delivery of our key programs, we completed a number of projects which will help shape the future focus of SLSNSW’s work in this area.

Our Beach to Bush program continues to be popular, delivering surf education to thousands of students living 50km or more away from the beach. The support of this year’s program by ClubsNSW and the Cancer Institute NSW enabled us to reach 12,000 students across 32 towns and cities in rural NSW.

Continued funding from the NSW Government’s Water Safety Black Spot Fund also enabled us to continue our engagement with an identified black spot location and age group, delivering surf education to high school students in Western Sydney. During the 12 month period from January-December 2015, we delivered vital safety information focusing on risk taking behaviour around water to around 3500 students in Western Sydney. The program was expanded to include practical, on-the-beach education (delivered in partnership with Surf Life Saving Illawarra Branch) and professional development workshops for school staff.

Working closely with our Media and Communications team, we have continued to support our Coastal Accommodation Network (a network of over 130 coastal accommodation providers throughout NSW) with the provision of resources, dangerous surf warnings and a regular e-newsletter. Through this network, we aim to raise awareness of beach safety among visitors to coastal locations, with the goal of ultimately reducing the incidence of rescues and drownings.

In 2015-16, work was also undertaken with an external research company to ensure that we are delivering evidence-based interventions that are robustly evaluated to ensure their effectiveness in reducing drowning. The outcomes of this work have provided us with greater clarity around where the future focus of work in Community Education should be targeted, and have informed the projects that we will be delivering for the next three years to address drowning black spots in NSW.

- Trialed webinar technology to increase reach of pre-season information dissemination to remote audiences
- Re-developed Training Officer course to improve course completion rates

# SURF SPORTS

“NSW representative teams have once again enjoyed good results in very tight competitive conditions which reflects the valuable pathway in place for our NSW athletes.”

What an exciting and challenging 12 months for surf sports in NSW. While the 2014–15 season stood out for some extreme weather conditions, the 2015–16 major championships enjoyed kinder conditions, with some exciting racing which was enjoyed by competitors, officials, volunteers and spectators. There have been some significant gains made across various areas of the sport including high performance, event delivery and sport touring teams which overall, directly aligns with SLSNSW's strategic priorities.

## Some of the key highlights for the 2015–2016 season were:

- Increased participation in a variety of major events, including the Stramit NSW Country Surf Life Saving Championships and the NSW Pool Rescue Championships.
- NSW joint winners (with Western Australia) of the ASRL Surf Boat Interstate Championship at Shellharbour, NSW.
- Mona Vale SLSC's Open Men surf boat crew was selected to represent Australia and defend the Trans-Tasman Test Series. Avalon Beach SLSC's U23 Men and Palm Beach SLSC's U23 Women were also selected to represent Australia in the Development series.
- NSW Open Team won the Ocean Interstate Championships in Victoria, while the Youth Team came in a close second, placing NSW second overall.
- 12 athletes and four team management members travelled as part of the U18 NSW Pool Rescue Development Team to compete at the New Zealand Pool Championships held in West Auckland with 4 of these athletes selected in the Australian Youth Team.
- 12 NSW athletes were selected in the Australian Life Saving Team to compete at the Lifesaving World Championships in the Netherlands in September 2016. Congratulations to the following athletes:

## Coaching

### Contributions were made toward the following strategic goals:

- To provide high quality education and accredited training to our members and the community
- To promote healthy lifestyles and wellbeing in the community
- To increase grassroots participation in sport and recreational activities at all levels of the movement

NSW made significant inroads into the future of coaching by adopting the new National Coaching Accreditation Scheme (NCAS), facilitating the NSW roll out for the 2015–16 season. The major change in NCAS has been a shift to online education to better suit the ever increasing demands on time for our volunteers. In the first year of the scheme, NSW has facilitated online learning for 22 Foundation Coaches and 48 Development Coaches. NCAS has been supported throughout the state by 33 mentors and 58 assessors. NSW is supporting the next stage of NCAS with at least three members involved in the pilot of the Performance Coach accreditation.

SLSNSW continues to offer numerous opportunities for new and developing coaches to learn from some of the most recognised and respected coaches in the sport through our Junior Development Academy, Beach High Performance, Pool Rescue and IRB Development clinics.

To continue to grow the coaching pathway, SLSNSW offers further opportunities for our up and coming coaches with Development or Assistant Coach positions available on some representative team tours and programs.

## Officiating

### Contributions were made toward the following strategic goals:

- To be adaptive, flexible and move with change
- To develop a culture where innovation thrives and is shared
- To offer diverse sport and recreational pathways to people of all abilities
- To invest in sporting pathways to ensure sustained participation

Our strategic priorities of Active for Life, Innovation of SLS and Learning for Life continue to be fostered and supported through quality officiating at all levels of competition within the organisation.

A new innovation this season was the design and delivery of a High Performance Officials Program, held in July 2015, which was aimed at fostering continuous improvement across the organisation, providing high quality education and accredited training to our members and the community and to invest in sporting pathways to ensure sustained participation in the sport into the future.

This program was aimed at officials in key positions and offered up and coming officials the potential to be selected to take part in an international surf or pool event with a NSW touring team by increasing their skills and knowledge. The main objective was to provide a succession plan for NSW and focused on the handover of skills and information from current high level officials to future and aspiring officials.

The program was facilitated by a team of NSW's most experienced officials. The current Australian Championships Deputy Referee and NSW Open Championships Referee, Donald van Keimpema lead the program and SLSNSW hand-picked a prominent official from each discipline of surf sports including Surf Boats, Water, Beach, IRBs and Pool to provide specialised information.

A Level 2 Officials course was delivered over two days in October with 23 attendees from 21 SLSCs. Three facilitators delivered the course at SLSNSW which included a section on Risk Management. The content of the course included a pre and post course assignment. Currently half of the attendees have completed the course and gained the accreditation.

SLSNSW accredited 270 new officials during the 2015-16 season. This brings the total number of accredited officials in NSW to:

- Junior – 330 (47 new)
- Level 1 – 1103 (211 new)
- Level 2 – 181 (12 new)
- Level 3 – 36

## Events

### Contributions were made toward the following strategic goals:

- To be adaptive, flexible and move with change
- To offer diverse sport and recreational pathways to people of all abilities
- To invest in sporting pathways to ensure sustained participation
- To enhance the health and fitness of our members
- To promote healthy lifestyles and wellbeing in the community
- To increase grassroots participation in sport and recreational activities at all levels of the movement

Continuous improvement in member satisfaction and safety at events are key focal points in surf sports and directly align with our strategic plan through the priority areas of Active for Life and Involving all Australians.

A total of eight Championship events and five other events were contested in NSW during the year, with the NSW Surf Life Saving Championships once again the blue ribbon event. This season was the final of a four-year hosting arrangement with Ocean Beach and Umina SLSCs for the NSW Championships. SLSNSW thanks the Organising Committee and the many members and supporters of the two host clubs who contributed over 4600 hours each year to successfully stage the event. Thanks must also go to our valuable partners at the former Gosford City Council (now Central Coast Council) for their ongoing support of the NSW Championships from 2013 to 2016. We now look forward to moving north to Swansea Belmont SLSC in 2017 and 2018.

The success of these events brings added pressure to further develop and improve competition to enhance the safety and overall experience for our members, volunteers and stakeholders.

The NSW Board Riding Championships were held as a stand-alone event for the first time in August 2015 with over 150 participants in short or long board events from U14 to Masters, from 45 SLSCs. Originally scheduled for Avoca Beach, the event was successfully delivered in contestable board riding conditions over three days at Copacabana Beach. This is an example of innovation in surf sports and offers another opportunity for members to participate in events which are outside the standard Surf Life Saving competitions.

SLSNSW works closely with host clubs and branches, along with local Councils, in order to deliver events of the highest quality. Our aim is for each of our members and stakeholders to walk away from an event with great memories and a positive attitude towards the organisation. SLSNSW acknowledges the enormous contribution made by clubs; from officiating to water safety and powercraft, from the work party to the competitors themselves. Together we achieve success through everyone working harmoniously together to showcase the sport of Surf Life Saving.

# SURF SPORTS CONTINUED

## Representative Teams and Athlete Development

### Contributions were made toward the following strategic goals:

- To develop a more inclusive organisation for all Australians to participate in
- To ensure our leadership reflects the diversity of our membership
- To foster the development of our state surf sport teams and athletes
- To invest in sporting pathways to ensure sustained participation

Our strategic priority of Active for Life continues to be supported through quality development programs, representative teams and other developmental opportunities.

Over the last five years SLSNSW has been very successful in developing, innovating and strengthening development opportunities in all phases of the athlete pathway. There are now numerous clinics and development programs aimed at the grassroots and intermediate levels such as Pool Rescue Development, IRB Development and the Junior Development Academy.

SLSNSW continues to develop our top tier athletes through various tours such as the U18 NSW Development Pool Rescue Team which competed at the New Zealand Pool Championships in 2015. Our elite athletes are also exposed to some of the best sports science technologies on offer through programs with the NSW Senior Performance Academy, NSW Pool Rescue High Performance Clinic and the NSW Beach High Performance Clinic.

NSW representative teams have once again enjoyed good results in very tight competitive conditions which reflects the valuable pathway in place for our NSW athletes. Our representative calendar started with the NSW IRB Interstate team finishing third overall at the Australian IRB Interstate Championships at Mooloolaba SLSC in July 2015. A NSW Pool Rescue Interstate Team claimed second overall at the Australian Pool Rescue Championships held in the Gold Coast in August 2015 where the format saw the pool rescue events separated from the Ocean Interstate for the first year. The NSW Surf Boat Interstate Team was declared joint winners of the ASRL Surf Boat Interstate hosted by Shellharbour SLSC in February 2016.

In January 2016, the NSW Surf Interstate Team travelled to Torquay in Victoria and came away with a very narrow second place in the overall pointscore. It was fitting NSW Head Coach Jeff “Mowie” Mowbray chose this event to step back from the NSW Team as Torquay was where it all began for him as Assistant Junior Coach at the 1999 Interstate Titles. Mowie’s efforts are acknowledged as a

significant factor in ensuring NSW has had a strong Interstate program for many years and we thank him for his leadership and dedication.

## Summary

SLSNSW is extremely fortunate to have continued support from a range of organisations including the Australian Sports Commission, Surf Life Saving Australia, various academies of sport and universities. This support allows us to build programs that not only benefit our athletes, but continue to up-skill and develop our coaches in NSW.

To continue to deliver against our strategic objectives in sport, SLSNSW requires dedicated members, strategic thinking and strong financial planning and leadership. After six years of valued contribution as Director of Surf Sports, Michael Bate chose not to stand for another term. Surf sports in NSW has gone from strength to strength and will continue to reap rewards for many years to come.

A huge thank you must go to all our NSW members who dedicate their time to advance the sport of Surf Life Saving in the key areas of event management, coaching, officiating, team management and various working groups. A special thanks goes to ‘Dad’s Army’ who continue to spend countless hours maintaining all the gear and equipment that is required at events throughout the year.

# GOVERNMENT RELATIONS & PEAK BODY REPRESENTATION

Surf Life Saving NSW's (SLSNSW) key strategic goals in relation to Government recognition in the SLSNSW Strategic Plan (2013-14 to 2016-17) are:

- To enhance our relationship with all levels of Government to promote the value of our organisation.
- To obtain Government recognition and funding to further our charitable purpose.
- To ensure we remain the recognised peak body for coastal public safety.

## GOVERNMENT FUNDING

SLSNSW would like to extend our thanks to the Premier and the NSW Government for supporting our operations, services and programs through the following grants, which enable us to further our charitable purpose.

### NSW Office of Sport

#### Capital Facility Development Program

The Surf Club Facility Grant Program was established 11 years ago to assist SLSCs throughout NSW develop their facilities to increase the usage, safety and participation in Surf Life Saving and the use of Surf Life Saving facilities by the general public, community groups and club members.

There was a delay in funding this year due to the review of audit assessments undertaken at all SLSCs in 2014-2015. Following the audit, a number of statutory and mandatory works were identified that need to be undertaken and the NSW Government has directed that the 2015-16 funding go towards addressing these issues. SLSNSW would like to acknowledge the support of the Department of Sport and Recreation team for their ongoing assistance.

#### NSW Sport and Recreation Events Program

Through the NSW Sport and Recreation Events Program, the NSW Government contributed \$5000 toward hosting the 2016 Stramit NSW Country Surf Life Saving Championships.

### NSW Office of Justice - Ministry for Emergency Services

#### Co-operative funding

Through the Ministry for Emergency Services, SLSNSW continues to receive ongoing funding for our state-wide operations through our Co-operative Agreement.

#### Water Safety Black Spots Fund

Through the NSW Government's Ministry for Police and Emergency Services Water Safety Black Spots Fund, Surf

Life Saving NSW received a grant of \$349,900 to complete the fourth year of 'Project Blueprint'. In its fourth year the state-wide Project Blueprint targeted priority black spots in the following Local Government Areas: Kempsey, Port Macquarie, Port Stephens, Newcastle, Greater Taree, Great Lakes and Lake Macquarie Local Government Areas.

The Water Safety Black Spots Fund also supported SLSNSW with a grant of \$60,000 to deliver surf safety education to students in schools at key residential black spot locations in Western Sydney. In the 2015 calendar year, SLSNSW delivered safety information to 3500 students in the area, along with providing practical education and professional development workshops for school staff.

#### Emergency Volunteer Support Services (EVSS) Grants

Through the EVSS grants, SLSNSW was successful in obtaining the following grants:

- \$24,250 to develop state-wide training capacity through provision of support for existing and new training assessors in each Branch.
- \$28,231 for the purchase of head/face airway models for every surf club in NSW to ensure compliance with the new units of competency for Apply Advanced Resuscitation Techniques.
- \$17,980 for Surf Club Open Day banners to assist surf clubs with recruitment.

### NSW Government Community Building Partnership Program

Surf Life Saving NSW would like to thank the Premier and the NSW Members of Parliament who provided funding to 13 surf clubs and Branches across nine electorates worth \$256,175 through the 2015 Community Building Partnership (CBP) Program.

#### NSW Family and Community Services (FaCS)

SLSNSW, for the third consecutive year has continued to work with FaCS to implement strategies which will give people living with disability, greater access to beach precincts in NSW through trials at Pambula, Newcastle and Bondi. A community grants program was promoted in each of these areas, which has seen a number of great initiatives commenced. For more information see the Member Services report.

### Department of Primary Industries

#### Observation Towers Funding Program

Through the NSW Department of Primary Industries' Observation Towers Funding Program, SLSNSW received \$12,987 in funding to purchase 13 Emergency Evacuation Alarms for surf clubs.

#### Federal Government

On behalf of our Surf Life Saving Clubs, we would like to thank the Federal Government for dedicating funding through the Beach Safety Equipment Fund which directed \$5000 to every surf club for the purchase of vital rescue equipment, first aid and medical supplies.



## GOVERNMENT ENGAGEMENT

### NSW Parliamentary Friends of Surf Life Saving

SLSNSW would like to thank Melinda Pavey MP for the active role she has undertaken as Chairperson of the NSW Parliamentary Friends of Surf Life Saving, along with our co-Deputy Chairs, Adam Crouch MP and Yasmin Catley MP. SLSNSW would like to thank all our Parliamentary Friends for their ongoing support of the activities of SLSNSW during the 56th term of Parliament. While many of our Parliamentary Friends are lifesavers themselves, we are pleased to see new members representing communities away from coastal areas lend their support.

#### Political representation at events

Our thanks goes to Bruce Notley-Smith MP for officially opening our 2015-2016 surf rescue patrol season on behalf of the Minister and to the Hon. Leslie Williams MP for attending our Awards of Excellence on behalf of the Premier and Minister. Thank you also to State MPs and the Mayors of Kempsey Shire and Gosford City Council who attended our Country and State Championships.

### Advocating the Priorities of the Organisation and its Members

#### Advocating for secure tenure of SLSCs on Crown Land

In terms of advocacy on the priorities of the organisation, one of the great successes this year was the historical announcement by the Minister for Primary Industries, Niall Blair MLC on the release of a standardised lease agreement for SLSCs on Crown Land. This is a significant milestone for our organisation. For the first time in our history it will provide affordable and secure tenure for our SLSCs situated on Crown land across the state.

#### Coastal Management Bill

SLSNSW provided a submission on the Coastal Management Bill to ensure that public safety was included as an overall objective of the Act. SLSNSW also advocated for consultation to be included on affected public authorities or authorities designated in emergency action sub-plans before a land management plan can be adopted. These considerations were incorporated into the Coastal Management Act.

#### Shark Management Inquiry

SLSNSW and the Australian Lifeguard Service (ALS) were represented at the Shark Management Inquiry held in Sydney in April this year. SLSNSW also provided a submission to the inquiry and highlighted the measures and strategies being undertaken by SLSNSW to mitigate shark encounters. These relate to patrolling beaches and ensuring supervision and surveillance, educating the community about sharks through the distribution of SharkSmart information through the Coastal Accommodation Network, and providing beach safety information through the Beachsafe App and website.

### Landmark agreement on Surf Life Saving Clubs on Crown Land – Innovation through Productive Partnerships

At the Department of Primary Industries (DPI) Active program awards night, an award was given in the Innovation category for the partnership between Land and Natural Resources (LNR) and SLSNSW for changing the way lease arrangements for SLSCs operate. Surf clubs located on Crown land across the state will have fewer hurdles to secure their long-term future after the historic signing of a deal between Surf Life Saving NSW and the State Government in late January.

For the first time in our history, SLSCs across the state have an alternative to going through lengthy processes to renew long-term leases, saving SLSCs time and money that can be better spent on keeping our beaches safe. There is now a standardised lease template that gives SLSCs an initial term of 20 years at minimum rent and allows them to conduct fundraising activities.

# GOVERNMENT ENGAGEMENT & PEAK BODY REPRESENTATION CONTINUED

## Peak Body Representation On Government And Industry Advisory Groups, Reference Groups And Committees

In recognition of our peak body status, SLSNSW was represented on a number of Government and industry-based committees, reference and advisory groups in 2015-16.

### New South Wales

Surf Life Saving NSW has representatives on the following state-based committees and groups:

- The NSW Water Safety Advisory Council, which consists of Government agencies and members of not-for-profit organisations focussed on preventing drowning and committed to water safety education and awareness. This includes organisations such as Royal Life Saving and Austswim.
- The NSW Safer Coastal Waters Sub-Committee, Marine Stakeholder Consultative Group, State Marine Rescue Consultative Committee and Rock Fishing Working Group.
- Sport NSW (NSW Sports Federation) whose mission is to lead NSW sport in building relevant, healthy communities.
- The Austswim NSW State Advisory Committee, which is the state industry body for the teaching of swimming and water safety.
- The Marine Consultative Meeting for the Bureau of Meteorology (BOM), which comprises agencies such as Marine Rescue NSW and Transport for NSW.
- The Emergency Services Spatial Information Group (ESSIC), which is run by the Emergency Information Coordination Unit (EICU) through the NSW Land and Property Information Department, to ensure that the emergency management sector has the best spatial and related data available to deal with multi-agency emergencies, such as terrorism and natural disasters.
- Regional Marine Rescue Sub-Committees, Regional Rescue Committees, Regional Emergency Management Committees and Local Emergency Management Committees across the state.
- The NSW Crown Holiday Parks Trust – Community Advisory Committee.

# MEMBER SERVICES

“Our clubs and branches continue to work hard in an environment where volunteerism across the community is in decline.”

The Member Services team has worked alongside our volunteers throughout 2015-16 to deliver various projects and programs which contribute to successful outcomes against the Surf Life Saving NSW Strategic Plan. To fulfil this there are eight key areas of work undertaken by the portfolio, including club sustainability, leadership, member growth, member recognition, junior membership, youth membership, inclusion and member protection.

The total membership for the 2015-16 season was 74,686, demonstrating a 3% decrease in overall membership from the previous season. In specific categories we saw a decrease in junior membership of 7.1% and also in the active patrolling membership by 1.2%.

Despite this our clubs and branches continue to work hard in an environment where volunteerism across the community is in decline, where those who do volunteer have less time to give, and where flexible, one-off and project volunteering are more popular models of volunteering than in the past. Congratulations to all those Surf Life Saving Clubs who have maintained or increased their membership base despite these challenges.

## Building Club Sustainability

**Contributions were made toward the following strategic goals:**

- To develop viable and sustainable clubs
- For all Surf Life Saving Clubs to achieve bronze level status in the Quality Club Program
- To optimise our resources and maximise the movement's capacity to deliver our future goals
- To foster continuous improvement across the organisation

In 2015-16 we saw a continued and strengthened focus on the strategic priorities of Healthy Clubs and an Effective State Movement. Projects such as the Club Guide and the Quality Club Program enable and support continuous improvement across the organisation, with the aim of continuing to build sustainability within our clubs.

Version 4.1 of the Club Guide was released online, providing clubs with a centralised resource for vital information about club operations. Supporting the implementation of this resource is the Quality Club Program. This financial year has seen a total of 60 clubs register for the program, up from 35 last year. Forty-two of these are aiming for Bronze, 13 aiming for Silver, and 4 are aiming for Gold level. This increase in participation is largely the result of resourcing, including three dedicated Quality Club Officers across the state. This increased resourcing has seen those clubs which need greater support, as identified through evidence-based health indicators, provided with more guidance and advice in an effort to empower clubs to operate effectively into the future.

Congratulations to all these clubs for their dedication to continuous improvement and work towards ensuring ongoing sustainability within their club.

The 2015-16 season saw the initial rollout of the Club Sustainability Program across the state. Through consultation with branch portfolio managers, key measurement criteria were developed. Club reports were created with input from the Member Services, Surf Sports, Lifesaving and Education portfolios and the results were summarised at a branch level, to assist identify clubs at risk. Due to time constraints for the delivery of club reports, only a few clubs engaged with the program in 2015-16; however, we hope to increase the use of this effective resource to assist all clubs in 2016-17.

## Developing Strong Leadership

**Contributions were made toward the following strategic goals:**

- To value members by providing them with recognition, direction and support
- To deliver a strategic unified effort to leverage the collective intelligence and skills of our people
- To ensure our leadership reflects the diversity of our membership
- Promoting volunteerism as a pathway to employment
- To develop a culture where innovation thrives and is shared

Our strategic priorities of Healthy Clubs, Effective State Movement, Involving All Australians and Learning for Life continue to be supported through the provision of high quality leadership development programs for our young people.

In addition to the funding provided to our Branches to run their own programs, Surf Life Saving NSW successfully delivered three leadership development programs which aimed to build individuals' capacity within the areas of leadership, teamwork, networking, interpersonal skills, problem solving, decision making and strategic planning. The programs also aim to provide participants with a better understanding of Surf Life Saving – its structure, processes and pathways – and to network and share ideas with like-minded peers from across the state.

The season kicked off with the Development Networking Program for members aged between 18 and 25 years, and toward the end of the season a program was run for our Under 14 Junior Lifesaver of the Year finalists, during which interviews were conducted to award our NSW Junior Lifesavers of the Year. Run in conjunction with this program was the Youth Opportunity Makers workshop for our 15 to 17 year old members. Additionally, a number of members were supported with their progression through to participating in national Surf Life Saving programs.

One of the key development opportunities within these programs is also the skills that are learnt and refined by our facilitation teams. Led and mentored by truly amazing volunteer coordinators, our facilitators gain confidence, learn team-work, communication, problem-solving, initiative, planning and organising skills. Thank you to all our 2015-16 facilitation teams!

## MEMBER SERVICES CONTINUED

### Recruiting And Retaining Membership

#### Contributions were made toward the following strategic goals:

- To increase membership each season
- To value members by providing them with recognition, direction and support
- To make it easier for members of the community to give, get involved and be safe
- To encourage volunteerism and broaden the volunteer base across the state

Volunteer recruitment and retention is another vital part of the work we do, contributing to our strategic priorities of Healthy Clubs and Involving all Australians. This work ensures Surf Life Saving Clubs in NSW remain strong and resilient.

The annual Surf Club Open Day was held on Sunday 18 October 2015, with 103 SLSCs (up from 67 clubs in 2014-15) opening their doors to the public to showcase their efforts in keeping our beaches safe and illustrating how people can give, get involved and be safe. In addition to the resources provided to participating clubs, Surf Life Saving NSW also coordinated state-wide media, resulting in a significant media presence for the event.

The SLSNSW Awards of Excellence, held on Saturday 29 August 2015 at the Four Seasons Hotel Sydney, recognised the outstanding achievements and contributions across all aspects of Surf Life Saving. Twenty award categories recognised the accomplishments of members, clubs and branches, with winners of many awards going forward to be nominated for national Surf Life Saving Awards. All nominees were exceptional and we were very pleased to see Lizzie Welborn awarded the Surf Life Saving Australia Young Athlete of the Year and Bellambi SLSC awarded the Community Education Program of the Year, which is a fantastic achievement.

Member Services also worked to have the outstanding achievements of our members, clubs and branches recognised outside the movement where possible. SLSNSW nominated members for the Sports NSW 2015 Community Sports Volunteer Awards, 2015 Sports Awards, NSW Water Safety Awards, NSW Sports Federation Awards, National Youth Awards and the Premier's Volunteer Recognition Award. Congratulations to our nominees, highly commended and winners in these awards.

### Innovating Junior Development Programs

#### Contributions were made toward the following strategic goals:

- To reduce the rate of drowning in NSW
- To increase grassroots participation in sport and recreational activities at all levels of the movement
- Enhance the health and fitness of our members
- To be adaptive, flexible and move with change

While Surf Life Saving NSW continues to provide guidance and support for clubs who are delivering junior development

programs, there has been a continued focus on expanding the opportunities to deliver surf education to children throughout NSW in an effort to meet our strategic priorities of Saving Lives 24/7, Active for Life and Innovating Surf Life Saving.

The 2015-16 Sydney Wet'n'Wild Nippers program hosted 228 Nippers in the U6-U12 age groups for a 10 week season which ran from 20 November through to a season finale carnival on 20 March 2016.

The Nippers were taught beach safety and awareness including beach signage, sun safety, personal safety and wellbeing, recognition of emergency situations and how to get help, identifying hazards in the surf, recognising unsafe behaviour and preventative actions, rescue techniques and first aid. They are also provided with ecosurf education including water conservation, sun safety, energy conservation and weather impacts. Surf sport activities provide an opportunity to practice the skills that may one day help them perform a rescue, including dolphin-diving, beach and water running techniques, body surfing and board use.

In addition to the 191 Junior Development Awards issued to the participants, 81 Nippers earned their Surf Life Saving Australia (SLSA) Basic First Aid certificate.

The Age Manager is a fundamental role within the Nippers program and they are responsible for the care, safety, wellbeing and development of the junior lifesaver. Thirty six parents volunteered for the role in the 2015-16 season at Wet'n'Wild.

SLSNSW members from coastal clubs supported the program in the roles of Water Safety personnel and Age Manager Assistants. Twenty clubs provided support, with a total of 1135 hours volunteered by members during the 11 weeks.

For the first time in the program, a coastal beach visit was organised with North Steyne SLSC on 10 January 2016, and 110 Nippers (approximately 400 people including family members) descended on Manly beach to test their skills in the surf. An unexpected outcome of the program was a two-way exchange of information between the North Steyne Age Managers and the 21 Wet'n'Wild Age Managers attending.

North Steyne SLSC did an outstanding job in organising a wonderful learning opportunity that extended the surf education experience for all participants. The club actively enriched our program by allowing the Sydney Wet'n'Wild Nippers to practice their new surf life saving skills in a dynamic beach environment, under the guidance of their Age Managers and Water Safety volunteers from North Steyne SLSC, Freshwater SLSC and Narrabeen SLSC.





## Involving All Australians

### Contributions were made toward the following strategic goals:

- For Surf Life Saving Clubs to be vibrant community hubs
- To develop a more inclusive organisation for all Australians to participate in
- To make it easier for members of the community to give, get involved and be safe
- To remain relevant to our members, the community and the Government

Inclusion is a key area of work for Surf Life Saving NSW, as it contributes toward our strategic priorities of Healthy Clubs, Involving all Australians and Innovating Surf Life Saving. While the inclusion of people from culturally, linguistically and diverse populations and those who identify as indigenous are important aspects to an inclusive organisation, we continued the focus on the inclusion of people with disability during the 2015-16 season.

We saw the implementation phase of the Surf Life Saving NSW Community Inclusion Project, a three year project funded by the Dept. of Family and Community Services (FaCS), which aims to see people with a disability enjoy improved access to beach precincts where their rights of equal and independent access, choice and inclusion are recognised and celebrated, enabling

them to fully participate in community life. The program included the roll out of a grants program for Surf Life Saving Clubs, community organisations and businesses located in the three trial areas.

This season has also seen a partnership between House with No Steps and Surf Life Saving NSW, with support from Surf Life Saving Hunter Branch, for the delivery of the New Wave Nippers Program. This trial initiative is testing a new model of support for clubs who are running programs for children with disability, which sees children and their families provided with the support needed to access the program, while our Surf Life Saving volunteers receive the training and support they need to ensure they can support the child to participate in the activities. We have also commenced work with an external contractor, funded through grant programs, to develop resources to ensure the future continuity of delivery of the New Wave Nippers program.

# FUNDRAISING AND PARTNERSHIPS

As a not-for-profit organisation and a registered charity, the importance of charitable donations and fundraising support from the community cannot be underestimated. To assist all NSW surf clubs and ensure they are equipped to patrol throughout the season, Surf Life Saving NSW (SLSNSW) has continued to professionalise and strengthen our fundraising efforts to maximise efficiencies and ensure targets are met, and where possible exceeded.

## Ongoing Fundraising Activity

**Raffle:** The 2015-16 season was the second year the Surf Life Saving Foundation (SLSF) was responsible for administering the national lottery program and national philanthropic program. SLSNSW currently receives a minimum guarantee of funds from the SLSF as a result of the national programs and SLSNSW continues to distribute 75% of all lottery income to compliant NSW branches and clubs.

**Go Fundraise:** SLSNSW continued its relationship with online fundraising platform Go Fundraise during 2015-16. This platform allows SLSNSW to leverage off major third party events in NSW, such as the Blackmores Sydney Marathon. SLSNSW is also able to use Go Fundraise to manage and create our own events and appeals.

**Be a Lifesaver:** The second year of the national ‘Be A Lifesaver’ campaign, set out to change perceptions and raise the profile of Surf Life Saving as a charity in need of philanthropic support. The national campaign, steered by Surf Life Saving Australia in conjunction with the Surf Life Saving Foundation, implemented a successful awareness and fundraising campaign that aimed to shift public perceptions about Surf Life Saving while encouraging donations and community support.

## Fundraising Events

SLSNSW delivers and supports a wide range of fundraising events to both promote awareness, and raise vital funds for state-wide operations. Over the last 12 months, we have built on our existing events and importantly grown our portfolio with the launch of the inaugural Bondi Beachfest in November 2015 where SLSNSW was delighted to be the official beneficiary. Partnering with already well established events as an official charity allows SLSNSW to generate fundraising income by leveraging off the participants, reputation and expertise of already successful and recognised events.

### Fundraising events in 2015-16 included:

- **Sydney International Boat Show:** The 2015 Sydney International Boat Show was held from 30 July to 3 August, 2015 at the Glebe Island Exhibition Centre. SLSNSW was offered a complimentary 3m x 3m stand in the “Marine Precinct” for the course of the event. SLSNSW distributed educational material and raised funds through the sales of ‘Beach Packs’ – containing a variety of beach essential items, such as sunscreen, board shorts and beach balls.

- **Woolworths Charity of the Month:** In November 2015, SLSNSW was nominated as the Charity of the Month at the Woolworths headquarters located at Bella Vista, NSW. The headquarters houses over 5,000 Woolworths employees and the company regularly showcases cultural and community organisations. SLSNSW was on-site for one week at the headquarters where fundraising efforts were generated through Christmas gift wrapping, the sale of ‘SLS Beach Packs’ and CPR demonstrations from the Australian Lifesaving Academy NSW.
- **Bondi Beachfest:** In November 2015, the first annual Beachfest was held at Bondi Beach with a headline performance from the Beach Boys. SLSNSW was the official charity beneficiary and a percentage of ticket proceeds was donated to SLSNSW as well as fundraising efforts which took place at the event.
- **Surf Life Saving NSW Race Day:** The second Surf Life Saving NSW Race Day presented by Segenhoe Stud, was held on Saturday 5 December 2015 at Royal Randwick Racecourse and marked the Australian Turf Club’s official start of summer racing calendar. This summer marked the second year of the five year partnership between Surf Life Saving NSW, Segenhoe Stud and the Australian Turf Club. The event provided an excellent opportunity to bring our movement together and for us to raise funds through onsite raffles, hospitality packages, race sponsorships, merchandise and sausage sizzles.
- **Australia Day:** SLSNSW held a fundraiser appeal at Circular Quay in Sydney prior to the Australia Day long weekend. On the day, we were collecting donations and selling SLS Beach Packs and thongs.

## The Future

Looking towards the 2016-17 financial year, Surf Life Saving NSW plans to focus on the following areas:

- Continuing our five year agreement for the Surf Life Saving Race Day presented by Segenhoe Stud and increasing fundraising efforts from this event year on year;
- Continuing relationship with Surf Life Saving Foundation by working together and liaising on a variety of Surf Life Saving fundraising programs for the benefit of all surf clubs;
- Growing SLSNSW Workplace Giving and Bequest programs;
- Building partnerships with third party events to increase SLSNSW fundraising opportunities and public presence;
- Identify ways in which fundraising for SLSNSW can be leveraged off existing partners and sponsors;
- Create exciting and innovative fundraising opportunities that are beyond the traditional ‘tin rattle’.

# MEDIA & COMMUNICATIONS

The main goal of the Media and Communications strategy is to enhance the Surf Life Saving brand while also communicating important information to the public and our own membership.

To meet these strategic aims, we conduct an extensive media relations program, which focuses on being both proactive and reactive to events and incidents that occur throughout the year. In addition, SLSNSW continues to develop relationships with all our key stakeholders and major partners, including Surf Life Saving Australia, state and federal governments, media outlets, emergency services agencies, sponsors and the general public.

Surf Life Saving NSW communicates to members in a variety of ways. This includes a weekly e-newsletter to all clubs, a strong digital presence on various social media channels including Facebook, Twitter, Instagram and LinkedIn, and our website which hosts a variety of resources for members and the public to access. In addition, we continued to publish our two magazines quarterly. Both *Beyond the Flags* and *SurfLIFE*; our publications for members and corporate audiences respectively are distributed online and in hard copy to surf clubs, sponsors and government agencies.

## Promoting the Brand

**Community Inclusion Project** - funded by the NSW Department of Family and Community Services was launched at North Bondi SLSC in November 2015 with a wide range of media organisations present. This project is aimed at improving the inclusion of people living with a disability within beach precincts at trial sites in Newcastle, Bondi and Pambula.

**Rip Current Campaign** - In early 2016, a communication working group was established to develop a national safety awareness campaign aimed at highlighting the dangers of rip currents. The campaign will be released nationally in October 2016 and aims to dispel the myths around who is most at risk of drowning due to rip currents and will provide beachgoers with information on identifying rips and what to do to survive these hazards.

## Flagship Activities

Our patrol season launch “Raising of the Flags” was at Coogee SLSC and was attended by the Hon Matt Thistlethwaite MP (Federal Member for Kingsford-Smith) and Bruce Notley-Smith MP (State Member for Coogee), along with local government representatives

and SLSNSW life members. It attracted significant media attention, reinforcing to the public the huge contribution made each year by surf lifesaving volunteers in NSW.

The NSW Surf Life Saving Championships were held at Ocean Beach-Umina during February/March for the fourth and final year. We were extremely well supported by media organisations on the Central Coast and throughout the state. We partnered with Southern Cross Austereo through its Central Coast radio stations SEA FM and 2GO including live broadcasts from the Championships venue. Again, NBN TV provided us with promotional support, airing Community Service Announcements in the lead up to the Championships, as well as covering the event in its nightly news and sports broadcasts. A two part, four hour highlights package from the event was aired on Fox Sports after the Championships, covering all the finals action.

Our state-wide Emergency Response System which coordinates callouts anytime, anywhere, has grown significantly and our media team is kept busy updating the public, through the media, on both serious incidents and successful rescues. This season has seen an increase in shark encounters and this ultimately increased the workload for the Media and Lifesaving teams as the threat from sharks become a widely publicised issue on the North Coast of NSW.

## Social Media and Online Presence

The Media and Communications team has continued to expand SLSNSW’s social media presence, utilising online networking channels to deliver information and better engage with members, particularly young volunteers. This year has seen our social media platforms grow on average over 42% (see graphic).

Video content has also been a strong focus for the team with the production of 15 videos which were shared on social media, showcasing the various activities, programs and people in Surf Life Saving. The combined amount of views was over 40,000 across social media channels. We also produced highlight packages for the NSW Age, Masters and Open Championships, *Sunset Wrap*, which were shared widely.

# BRANCH REPORTS

# FAR NORTH COAST

The 2015-16 season has been a challenging one for the 10 clubs from Yamba to Fingal Head, the Ballina Jet Boat and everyone associated with Far North Coast lifesaving. There's an expectation from the public that when there's a patrol on duty, people are safe - and we have to meet that challenge.

Last season 735 State Operations Centre requests for assistance were received during the season throughout New South Wales, and of that figure almost one third, or 233, were on the Far North Coast.

Many of our lifesavers have gone beyond the call of duty this season, and I know we can all be proud of our wonderful organisation.

## Achievements

- This season we experienced increased demand for our services outside the patrolling season as well as after hours. Fortunately the Branch was able to secure sponsorship from Newcastle Permanent to purchase two new 4WD vehicles. The Jet Ski fleet has also increased to six and man hours spent on these skis significantly boosted.
- The Annual General Meeting was held at Cudgen Headland Surf Club and the Board welcomed a new Secretary (Leanne Moore), a new Director of Lifesaving (Chris Samuels) and a new Director of Surf Sports (Debbie Pawsey).
- Far North Coast Branch celebrated its 80th season at our Awards of Excellence evening at Twin Towns. Cudgen Headland won Club of the Year and Jimmy Keough received the President's Award for Outstanding Service to Surf Life Saving.
- Fingal Rovers SLSC was rewarded with the National and NSW Rescue of the Month award for October after Debrah Cheers rescued a female who had bravely entered the water to save the life of a child swept from rocks at Fingal Headland. Chris Dennis rescued the young boy, but the woman unfortunately couldn't be revived.
- Members from Far North Coast received a number of individual accolades this season. Darcy Morrow and Eoin Johnston were recognised with 50 Year Service Awards at Ballina, while Garry Meredith was announced Volunteer of the Year for Ballina Shire region.

- Our Branch Junior Lifesaver of the Year winners, Hayley Smith (Cudgen Headland SLSC) and Zane Patience (Cabarita Beach SLSC) represented the Far North Coast at Surf Life Saving NSW's development program.
- The Yamba Rescue Facility was opened by Chris Gulaptis, MP for Clarence.
- In surf sports, the Far North Coast was successful at the NSW Interbranch Championships, claiming the title of the top Country Branch and finishing fifth overall.
- Ballina Lighthouse & Lismore took out the title in the Branch Pool Rescue Championships at Southern Cross University.
- The Byron Bay duo of Jy Timperley and Gabrielle Kay competed for Australia in the New Zealand Pool Rescue Championships in October. Jy and Gabrielle continued their form into the surf for Byron Bay where the club took out the NSW Country Championships by the narrowest of margins over Cudgen Headland at South West Rocks SLSC in February. Byron Bay's successful season continued at the Branch Titles where they finished ahead of close rivals Cudgen Headland.

In 2015-16 our clubs patrolled from Camden Haven to Macksville-Scotts Head and continued to perform a vital community service for the Mid North Coast. ## Achievements

- Our Community Education Program for school students reached 6,000 participants which is an outstanding achievement. Our thanks go to everyone involved in this important project. I must also acknowledge Newcastle Permanent Charitable Foundation gave HSLS a new 4WD for our Community Education program in order to tow the trailer.
- Seven of our surf clubs were involved in the special needs New Wave program. This program gives people living with a disability an opportunity to participate in Surf Life Saving. This is also a great retention program with many youth and older members facilitating it.
- Congratulations to Jade Williams (Cooks Hill SLSC) and Luke Walmsley (Caves Beach SLSC) who represented HSLS at the Surf Life Saving NSW Junior Lifesaver of the Year program.
- HSLS hosted a round of KNG Iron Series, Summer of Surf and Wave Warriors this season which proved to be a draw card to our area. Short sharp carnivals have been a great hit with athletes, officials and parents. A special mention must go to Daniel Collins from Redhead SLSC who represented Australia in Japan at the Sanyo Cup earlier in the year.
- Our 13 clubs were again breach free for a second year, with the clubs working hard to reach their sustainability targets. This has strengthened patrols, given club captains a better rostering system, and produced very confident and happy patrolling members. HSLS currently has 15 Duty Officers and 35 RWC Drivers, and this season we also replaced four RWCs in our fleet of craft.
- HSLS introduced a Central Venue Assessment Program, and this was positioned in the middle of the Branch at Stockton Beach SLSC. All practical assessments were conducted on a Saturday morning. Assessors were eager to participate as dates were set before the season started.
- Our trainers were happy as squad commencement dates were 10 weeks apart and all members in the Branch knew of squads to enrol in.

- HSLS has entered into a Memorandum Of Understanding with Hunter TAFE to educate members in Certificate 4 in Leadership and Management. So far 40 members have participated in this program.
- Sustainability charts for patrols, education and officials has assisted all 13 clubs meet targets to ensure future viability, with all clubs having participated in the Quality Club Program for four years. The standard of governance in the clubs is very good, which makes for happy members.
- Seven members gained the Certificate 4 in Assessing and Training; and this has ensured every club has qualified trainers and assessors.

- A special mention must go to Denver Brown from Wamberal SLSC who won National and NSW Rescue of the Month for November after he rescued two female teenagers who were struggling in a rip off Wamberal Beach.
- Avoca Beach SLSC won the NSW Rescue of the Month award for January thanks to the efforts of their surf lifesavers who treated 11 beachgoers who had sustained serious injuries after being knocked over by a freak wave on the rocks south of the clubhouse.
- The SLSCC Board of Surf Sports implemented many exciting new initiatives this season which has led to increased participation. Highlights included working with the elite Nutri-Grain Ironperson Series to provide our grass root U10-U17 aspiring athletes competition opportunities, co-ordinating with the North Coast Boat Series to hold the first combined Boat Series event, the implementation of a unique Board and Ski series with a format not seen before in Surf Life Saving. Goals of this series were that the competitors had fun as well as increasing participation, and this was certainly achieved.
- Our Member Services teams continue to deliver many programs targeted at developing and retaining our youth including the Junior Life Saver of the Year, Rookie Lifesaver Program, 13-14 Development Camp, and 15-17 Youth Leadership Program which toured the NSW North Coast
- Congratulations to our Junior Lifesaver of the Year winners, Cerys Cousins (MacMasters Beach SLSC) and Dylan Barrett (Ocean Beach SLSC) who represented our Branch at Surf Life Saving NSW's development program.

This was a positive step in the right direction and we hope to see SLSNSW add even more efficiencies to education requirements to support our volunteers into the future.

We sincerely thank the patrolling members of our 21 clubs for their efforts over what was a long, hot summer, especially through the month of February!

## Achievements

- The Branch continues to focus its efforts towards helping our clubs and we have developed and delivered on a number of initiatives across all portfolios to make life easier at club level.
- Congratulations to Yao Xen Tan (North Steyne SLSC) and Michele Kaye & Nigel Kassulke (Manly LSC) who were awarded February National and NSW Rescue of the Month award for reviving a swimmer who was brought to shore not breathing by local surfers at Manly Beach.
- My President's Award for this season went to North Steyne SLSC for their initiative in bringing the Sydney Wet'n'Wild Nippers to North Steyne for a "real surf" day. The Sydney Wet'n'Wild Nippers interacted well with the North Steyne Nippers in what is now planned as an annual event.
- Surf Sport Highlights included the Branch retaining its Interbranch title for the second year; Manly winning its 7th consecutive NSW Age Championships; Newport winning the NSW Open Championships for the third year running; and at Aussies, Newport coming 3rd, Manly 7th and our clubs claiming 25 per cent of all medals on offer - an outstanding result.
- All of our clubs performed at a high level throughout the season as was reflected in our patrol audits. All of our clubs achieved 94% or higher on at least one audit, reflecting the overall high standards. The Branch allocated \$20,000 to the top seven place getters in our patrol competition - the money to be spent on lifesaving equipment.

- We are grateful for the support provided by Dee Why RSL Club who provided funding through the Clubs Grant program over three years for a new Surf Rescue vehicle. This new vehicle is being fitted out for use by our Duty Officers for the coming season.
- It was another busy season in the Education portfolio. We processed just under 8,000 new awards including over 1,100 advanced lifesaving awards. We continued to assess Bronze and SRC at central venues not only relieving the pressure on our Assessors but also improving the overall standard and uniformity of our assessments. A big thank you to all who are involved in training and assessing within our Branch - you are a wonderful and talented team.
- In the Member Services area we had strong participation in our Junior Lifesaver of the Year category with some very capable and inspiring young members being nominated by our clubs. We were thrilled when Ella Cook from Narrabeen Beach SLSC was announced as the female Junior Lifesaver of the Year and commend our male finalist Zizo Ayoub from Dee Why SLSC.

- Quality Club Program with 9 of the 15 clubs engaged – managed by Director of Member Services, Trent Thomas

- North Bondi and South Maroubra SLSCs were awarded National and NSW Rescue of the Month awards for April 2016 and July/August 2015 respectively. South Maroubra won their award after rescuing a fisherman who had broken his leg after falling off rocks at Malabar Headland on 9 August 2015. North Bondi Patrol 14 rescued a group of swimmers from dangerous conditions near rocks on 23 April 2016.
- The 2015-16 Surf Life Saving Sydney Awards of Excellence was a great success and a tribute to the work the Board and office staff put into the evening. The evening saw recognition of the best lifesavers and competitors in our Branch.
- The number of new Bronze awards has decreased slightly this season, however we had 3% increase in Bronze proficiency numbers across the Branch.

Congratulations to members of Surf Life Saving Illawarra (SLSI) for another successful season. Well done to our patrolling members whose efforts ensured no lives lost for another year. I am very proud of the hard work and achievements made by each of our 17 clubs throughout the 2015-16 season.

## Achievements

- Congratulations to Helensburgh-Stanwell Park surf lifesavers, Jorja Williams and Keehan Reilly who represented SLSI at the SLSNSW Junior Lifesaver of the Year program.
- An outstanding accomplishment was achieved by Bulli SLSC President, Keith Caldwell, who was announced as a Life Member of Surf Life Saving NSW earlier this year.
- Bulli surf lifesavers were awarded National and NSW Rescue of the Month for December 2015 thanks to their efforts rescuing six swimmers after a large set of waves barrelled through the flagged area at Bulli Beach and pulled them 100 metres out to sea.
- Anthony Turner was an outstanding success in his commitment to Surf Life Saving in his role as Director of Lifesaving.
- The 14th season of the Sydney Water Surf Series had close to 1,100 athletes compete over four rounds which included the last round as part of the Summer of Surf series.
- A new initiative focusing on the development of our surf sports athletes was established for U12-U19 surf/craft members. A group of between 30-40 athletes registered for the two sessions per week all season. The program assisted clubs in the new Coaching Framework and developed quality/depth of our Branch team improving skills and results.
- The 2016 Australian Championships were a highlight for Illawarra clubs. Congratulations to the Bulli Open Men's Boat Crew and Helensburgh-Stanwell Park Open Female Beach Relay team who won gold. It was a season to remember for beach sprinter Samuel Zustovich (Helensburgh-Stanwell Park) as he claimed the treble of gold at Branch, State and Aussies in the U14 Male Beach Flags.
- SLSI were successful in numerous grants that helped supply our members with three new RWCs, two new beach trailers, three new road trailers and three new radios.
- A big step forward for our Branch was the digital radio network upgrade.
- 2015-16 was a very successful season for Illawarra Branch in Education. We had a very strong start to the season with over 50 TAFs attending our pre-season conference held at Wollongong City SLSC and this enthusiasm continued with great attendance numbers at each of our Education meetings. There were 194 new Bronze Medallion holders and a total of 5769 new awards to our Illawarra members.
- Trials of electronic paperwork for award processing and streamlining of systems ensured we followed 100% compliance for our Registered Training Organisation requirements.

It is with pride I report to you that South Coast Surf Life Saving has continued to provide an outstanding level of patrol and rescue service to the South Coast community. Our lifesaving members are performing to a high level, and have a strong commitment to the safety of everyone who visits our beaches.

Our volunteer branch and club administrators contribute a highly valued level of commitment to the operations, administration, support, fundraising and financial service to their clubs. ## Achievements

- The South Coast Branch Community and School Education program was delivered during the months of September to January. The School Education component saw some 2,100 students participate in the program, which was led by our team of Sue Whitford and Adam Woodward. Sessions were delivered in the southern Illawarra, South Coast, Southern Highlands, Goulburn and Braidwood District.
- During the peak summer holiday period of December and January our team along with Dr Rob Brander of UNSW delivered our water safety program in conjunction with Rob's "Science of the Surf" talks to many visiting tourists with the series commencing at Shellharbour SLSC, then Mollymook SLSC and to Bawley Point/Kioloa Community Club. Dr Brander delivered one of his lectures on the beach at Bawley Point following the Bawley Ironman Carnival.
- A number of significant sport events were held across the branch during the season. Shellharbour SLSC hosted the Australian Surf Rowers League Open Championships, Branch Championships and a carnival of the Sydney Water Series, and will again host the ASRL Open Championships in 2016-17 season.

## NEW LIFE MEMBERS



### Ken Sellers - The Entrance

Ken's journey into Surf Life Saving began when he joined The Lakes club back in 1969.
