Subject:	Grant Opportunity – NSW Community Building Partnership (Closing 15 June 2018)

The <u>NSW Community Building Partnership Program</u> funds community infrastructure projects that deliver positive social, environmental and recreational outcomes and promote community participation, inclusion and cohesion. This Program funds projects in each State Electorate of NSW, with \$330,000 available to fund projects in every NSW State Electorate. (Electorate information can be found on the CBP website or at <u>http://streetlist.elections.nsw.gov.au/</u>).

This Program offers \$2,500 to \$330,000 per applicant (average grant is \$20,000) for

- construction of new community infrastructure; or
- refurbishment, repair and maintenance to existing community infrastructure; or
- the purchase of capital equipment with a minimum individual asset value of \$2,500 and a projected life expectancy of 5+ years

Projects under this Program must be completed by 31 March 2020.

Please note the following key points:

- Applicants can apply for a project that is a component or stage within a larger project
- Not-for-profit organisations must be incorporated and have a current and up-to-date record on the Australian Charities
 and Not-for-Profits Commission (any organisation that has defaulted on providing required documentation to the
 Commission will have funding withheld (if the project is successful) until records with the Commission are resolved
- Organisations with two or more un-acquitted CBP projects rom CBP2015-16. Eligibility will be assessed based on CBP2015-16 acquittal paperwork received by the CBP team on or before 15 June 2018
- The following items are **NOT** eligible for funding: works commenced prior to closing date 15 June 2018; workshops, training and events; planning and development consent costs in their own right (these costs can form up to 5% of a larger project); and development of commercial ventures, e.g. café or licenced area; programs. For the full list of ineligible items, please see the Program guidelines (link below)
- Preference will be given to projects already granted Development Consent (if required); however applicants in discussion with their Council to lodge an application will be considered and must be granted Development Consent by 31 July 2019
- Eligible not-for-profit organisations can seek the entire project cost as a grant, however, favourable consideration will be given to those projects with contributions from their own or from other sources, including in-kind contributions
- Land owner or property owner consent (if applicable) and quotes for the project will be required
