SLSNSW is excited to announce the opening of applications for the 2018 Youth Opportunity Makers Workshop!

Surf Life Saving New South Wales invites nominations for the 2018/2019 Youth Opportunity Makers Workshop. The workshop is geared towards creating greater awareness of opportunities and individual abilities in 15-17 year old members. Branches are encouraged to use this workshop as a method of recognising members who have the potential to develop skills further by working with like-minded youth.

The workshop will be sponsored by Surf Life Saving New South Wales, and held from Monday 15th April to Wednesday 17th April 2019, at The Collaroy Centre on Sydney’s Northern Beaches.

The workshop is aimed at members whose Clubs and Branches believe they have qualities that can be developed to enhance the future of the Club and Branch. Aims of the workshop include:

- To create situations that promote fun learning experiences
- To create an awareness of current issues, pathways and opportunities
- To promote teamwork, communication skills and goal setting
- To develop confidence and self-esteem in a supportive environment whilst positively recognising members

- Provide opportunities for ideas to be exchanged

Participants will take part in focused learning, presentations and workshops as well as some great fun activities and challenges.

SLSNSW will cover costs of flights, accommodation, meals and activities for those members attending the development camp.

All applicants will need to complete the Jotform Application online (click [here](#)) Applications close at 9am Monday 4th February 2019. SLSNSW will then forward applications to the respective Branches for prioritisation and endorsement. Branches will then send all applications back to SLSNSW where a final allocation of positions will take place.

Each Branch will be allocated at least two (2) positions in the program and should rank additional applicants in preferential order. Ideally one male and one female applicant per Branch will be represented. Positions not filled will be allocated to the most promising applicants from other Branches.
