



2019 NSW Envirobank Country Championships Final Event Information Guide – Friday 25 January, 2019

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Introduction

The 2019 NSW Envirobank Country Championships will be held at Cudgen Headland SLSC. With over 1,400 competitors, 150 officials and 3,000 spectators the event is shaping up to be a great spectacle.

As per the entry circular no individual late entries will be accepted at the Championships. (*Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of SLSNSW e.g. a competitor must be a team member replacing another team member in a team already entered).

While every effort is made to ensure the results are accurate it is the competitors' own responsibility to ensure that they have their name, club and position correctly recorded.

Team App

Team App will be used throughout the Championship as a platform to communicate important information and timetable changes to Team Managers and Competitors.

To register for these live event updates please follow the below instructions:

1. Download the "Team App" application from the App Store or Google Play
2. Log in / Sign up to receive live event notifications
3. Once logged in search "2019 NSW Country Championships"
4. Click the "Become a member of this team app" icon at the top of the screen then select the "Competitors" Group
5. Ensure that you have notifications enabled (check this within the app)



By joining the event and turning on your mobile app notifications, you will receive immediate notifications and email updates as they are posted, ensuring you never miss any important information.

Team Managers Meeting

A **compulsory** Team Managers meeting will be held in the Cudgen Headland Surf Life Saving Club Training Room upstairs at **6pm** on Friday 1st February. Team Managers or their representatives are asked to be there 5-10 minutes early.

IMPORTANT: Sign on for Double Ski, R&R and Surf Board riding will be done at the Team Managers Meeting. Please be aware of your teams competitor numbers in these events prior to this meeting. This will ensure that the draws can be amended before the events.

Lycra Vest Collection

Thank you to all Clubs for completing the lycra vest order form. As a friendly reminder, these pink lycra vests are mandatory for all competitors throughout the entire Championships to support the event sponsor Envirobank. Please wear these in all events including beach (march past is excepted). Please ensure all competitors retain theirs for the duration of the competition.

Lycra vests will be able to be collected at the Administration and Help Desk which is located downstairs of the Cudgen Headland Surf Club between 4:30pm – 6pm on Friday 1 February or between 630am – 730am on Saturday 2 February. Please note that one nominated person from your Club will be responsible for collecting the entire order of lycra vests for all competitors. Lycra vests will not be individually distributed to competitors. Please note that some orders have been amended to fit within the bulk order placed with the supplier several months ago.

Notes to map:

- The closest car park will be north of the Bowls Club and this will include a \$10 a day fee. Other free parking is available at Ed Parker Rotary Park.
- Street parking is very limited, time restricted and paid parking.

- A bus drop off zone will be in operation at the surf club. Buses will then be directed to the paid parking site north of the bowls club.
- No competition parking is permitted in the Cudgen Headland SLSC car park or in local only parking areas identified on the map above. Parking is also not permitted in the narrow side lanes around the community. Illegal parking will see your vehicles towed or fined.
- Clubs are asked to set club tents along the beach as directed by the Club work party and where indicated by signage on beach. No tents are to be set up on the grass areas near the club, including the large oval to the North of the club.

Competition Area

The competition area will be made up of 11 areas – 8 x water areas (pink, black/white, orange, green/yellow, red, blue/white, boats and board riding) and 3 beach areas (sprint & flags).

No competitor should be within 50m of the water areas whilst the courses are being set by the SLSNSW IRB powercraft team. This is not only a safety issue but it ensures that the courses are correct. Any members/clubs that do not adhere to this may face a disciplinary committee.

Entry to the competition arena will be via the marshalling areas. No member, Coach, or Team Manager will be permitted to enter the competition arena unless escorted by a Competition Official.

Only one handler per competitor (ironman etc.) will be permitted in the competition arena.

The spectator area where possible, will be directly behind the competition arenas together with a pedestrian walkway. The competition arena will be "out of bounds" for everyone except the competitors in the events being conducted.

Warm Up Area

The warm up area for swimming will be the single coloured water areas where as craft will be the double coloured water areas. It is recommended that all clubs continue with their risk assessments prior to entering the water for warm up activities. All competitors warming up **MUST** wear Pink High – Visibility Rash Vest. No warm ups should be done prior to 7am.

Stallholder Area

Surf Life Saving NSW will be selling official merchandise during the Championships.

There are also a number of stallholders attending the event including Engine, Kozii, Ezy Beach, Jolyn, Drom Clothing, Fashion Fish, Dolphin, Sharkskin and Envirobank.

Cudgen Headland

Cudgen Headland SLSC has 2 BBQs (opening at 7am) running on the beach throughout the duration of the Championships.

Cudgen Headland SLSC also has a bistro open 7 days a week from 12pm, with the bar opening at 11am each day. In addition to the Bistro, Cudgen Headland will also be hosting a Gourmet BBQ downstairs by private booking only. To book at the Bistro or Gourmet BBQ please call (02) 6674 1573 .

Bus Pick Up Service

To assist clubs, Cudgen Headland SLSC will be running a bus pick up service on competition mornings. If your team is located within 10 -15 minute drive of the Club and require pick up from your accommodation please contact Cudgen Headland SLSC on 6674 1573 to arrange. All bookings must be made at least one day prior.

Note: SLSNSW as the event organiser, reserves the right to add or delete, change any events on the day of competition if safety, weather conditions, programming or other conditions warrant.

Competition Information

Requirement for all events: ALL COMPETITORS must have their age group on their arm e.g. U30-U39, U14. They will not be able to start unless this happens.

Requirement for boat event: ALL SWEEPS must hold a current coaching accreditation and a surf boat sweeps accreditation in order to compete.

Surf Boats

Surf boats should arrive at the Cudgen Headland SLSC on **Friday afternoon between 12pm – 5pm** at the designated drop off zone south of the Clubhouse. The Club will then transport and store the boats in front of the Clubhouse overnight and then transport the boats down to the boat area on Saturday. Although security will be on site, please ensure no valuables are left on site.

If you require a surf boat drop off time later than 5pm on Friday, please contact Cudgen Headland SLSC before Wednesday 30 January to arrange.

Clashing of Events

While every effort will be made by the Event Referees to avoid clashes in the timetable, athletes will have to decide to contest one or the other.

Competitor Liaison Officers have been appointed in most areas to assist competitors. Clashing of events is not anticipated in the finals however, some clashes may be experienced during the heats. Any competitor who finds that their event clashes with another event should consult their Team Manager, who in turn should consult the Competitor Liaison Officer in the relevant area.

Competitor Liaison Officers will liaise with the various Sectional Referees to arrange deferment of heats, if possible, to enable competitors to obtain the maximum possible opportunity to compete. These arrangements will only apply between areas and not between events in the one area. Events will not be held up for competitors competing outside their age group.

Event Safety

Water Safety

Clubs on the roster below are required to provide a minimum of 2 water safety personnel to monitor the Ages (U/8 to U/14). Water safety personnel will need to supply their own lunch/food, orange high vis rash vest, cap, fins and rescue tube. All water safety personnel must have a minimum current proficient Surf Rescue Certificate.

What to do:

1. Water safety personnel are to sign on 15 minutes prior to the start of each shift at the Administration and Help Desk (downstairs of Cudgen SLSC).
2. You will be provided with a briefing.
3. Proceed to your assigned area and inform the Sectional Referees of your presence.

Any issues from competitors, team managers or officials regarding water safety must be raised with the Water Safety Coordinator.

What to do:

1. Powercraft personnel are to sign on 15 minutes prior to the start of each shift at the Administration and Help Desk (downstairs of Cudgen SLSC).
2. You will be provided with a briefing.
3. Proceed to your assigned area.

All members reporting for duty must have their 2018/19 powercraft licence and provide their own lifejackets.

Contingency Location

Should the competition be moved due to unforeseen circumstances, the first contingency location is Cudgen River – near Ed Parker Rotary Park, approximately 2 minutes' drive south. The second contingency location is Cudgen River near Jack Julius which is approximately 3 minutes' drive south. As per usual the Competition Safety Committee will communicate any change or update via Club Team Managers.

Aim and Principles of Relocation:

The aim of relocating part or all of an event is to attempt to ensure that the competition is safely conducted within the set timeframe.

Assessment of Conditions and Investigation of Alternative Venues:

The Competition Committee is responsible for assessing the situation and making a decision as to whether part or the entire event is relocated.

Relocation Timings:

The decision to relocate part or all of an event will be made as early as possible.

If the event is to be relocated, a decision must be made as to the following:

- The events to be moved
- The timings to commence the relocated events
- The alternative location to be use

Medal Collection

All medals must be collected at the Championships, they will not be posted or available for collection at the State Championships. One person is asked to collect all team event medals and they will not be handed out individually.

Photography & Media

Photography:

As a condition of entry, all competitors agree to have photos and video taken during the Championships used for promotional material by SLSNSW. SLSNSW will not be issuing media/photography accreditation to team members or team management. Professional photographers will be attending and material will be available via social media and

to Clubs on request. Club Team Management are welcome to take photographs from outside the competition area. Go Pro's may only be used within the competition area on approved fittings and fixtures as set out in relevant SLSA bulletins.

Media:

No competitor, team manager, official or spokesperson for a club shall make media statements which could bring the Country Championship, its sponsors, or officials into controversy or disrepute. Such statements will be a breach of policy and could potentially result in sanctions against members involved. Please note that statements to the media regarding about the Championships will be made only by approved authorised spokespeople.

Drones:

For the safety of competitors, officials and spectators SLSNSW prohibits the use of drones or Unmanned Aerial Vehicles (UAV) at these Championships by members and/or public unless approved by SLSNSW, 7 days prior to the event. The operator must supply an operations manual (including risk management plan), provide a copy of public liability insurance and comply with all Civil Aviation Safety Authority (CASA) requirements. SLSNSW will be utilising the services of Lifesaving UAVs to conduct aerial surveillance and monitor hazards.

Security

There will be security on site for the nights of Friday, Saturday and Sunday. Although security is present, any valuables should not be left in Club tents and should be taken with you at the end of the day.

Any person/s found stealing signage or any equipment owned by SLSNSW or its sponsors will immediately be brought before a Carnival Disciplinary Committee or a SLSNSW Judiciary for further action.

Please note that automatic disqualification of the team/club from the championship may occur if any member is found guilty of theft.
