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Subject:	Grant Opportunity – ClubGRANTS Category 3 2019-20 Infrastructure Grants	

The <u>ClubGRANTS Category 3 2019-20 Infrastructure Grants</u> program is now open for applications. Infrastructure Grants are made possible by reinvesting a rebate on gaming machine profits from the state's registered clubs.

IMPORTANT:

- These grants are highly competitive with less than 10 recipients in each category per round (less than 30 recipients per round statewide)
- Applicants MUST have development approval prior to applying (or written exemption if applicable).
- Infrastructure <u>MUST be accessible and available to the general public majority of the time</u>, e.g. shared by multiple organisations.

There will be three rounds of grants in 2019-20:

Round 1	Opens 5 August 2019	Closes 26 August 2019
Round 2	Opens 18 November 2019	Closes 9 December 2019
Round 3	Opens 16 March 2020	Closes 6 April 2020

- \$100,000 to \$300,000 are available for Sport and Recreation projects for use towards the costs of construction, alteration, renovation, completion and fitout of buildings
- <u>\$50,000 to \$200,000</u> are available for Disaster Readiness and Community Infrastructure projects for use towards the costs of construction, alteration, renovation, completion and fitout of buildings

Key Details:

- Applications must include:
 - o **Development Approval** certificate or reference number, or evidence of exemption
 - Up to three letters demonstrating community support for the proposal from groups that will directly benefit and engage with the planned infrastructure project. Letters from government employees or representatives are not accepted.
 - o Evidence of owner's consent to undertake the works (if leasing a property)
- Successful projects must be completed within two years of the funding commencing.
- In the assessment process consideration is given to projects which provide benefit to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities; regional and remote communities; people with disability; and/or culturally and linguistically diverse communities.
