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### EVENT INFORMATION:

States will be responsible for the selection of their representative teams and make their own arrangements regarding equipment, transportation of teams and outfitting. SLSA will supply the competition lycras.

Insurance for all competition equipment including tents, trailers and surf craft is the responsibility of the States. SLSA will not accept the responsibility for loss, damage or theft of equipment.

For event management purposes, SLSA will recognise a maximum of two (2) team management officials for each team.

**Note:** It is highly recommended that teams appoint an equal number of males and females.

### COMPETITION BRIEFINGS

A briefing for team managers and key officials will be conducted by the Event Referee the morning of each round inside the host club. Times will be advised at a later date.

The officials to be in attendance include the Event Referee, Deputy Referee, Safety and Emergency Management Coordinator, and key Officials/SLSA personnel.

Teams should have a minimum of one and maximum of three personnel attend the briefing.

### EVENT COMMUNICATION

The SSTL will be using the 'Team App' smartphone application to send out updates and notifications to Team Managers and competitors. Please see the instructions below to understand what 'Team App' is and how to use it. It may also be helpful to visit the website for further clarification at <https://www.teamapp.com/faqs>.

#### HOW DO I USE TEAM APP?

Download 'Team App' from the App Store or Google Play. Once you have downloaded the app and created your user login, search for '**Super Surf Teams League**' in the search bar at the top of the screen and click on the event to join. From here you will be able to access news feeds, event timings and where to find all the latest and up to date information on the event. By joining the event and turning on your mobile app notifications, you will receive an immediate text and email update as they are posted, ensuring you never miss any important information!

'Team App' is applicable for all Apple iPhones, iPads and iPods, plus most Android mobile devices.

**\*\*Please note it is imperative that Team Managers, and preferably also competitors once teams are selected, sign up for this application to receive important race information. Whilst Facebook and other channels will post periodic updates; the 'Team App' will be the main point of communication between the events team, Team Managers and competitors. This will be replacing the SMS text messaging service used previously at Surf life Saving Australia events.\*\***

### COMPETITION EQUIPMENT AND SPECIFICATIONS

Each team shall be responsible for the provision of their own surf craft. All equipment used in competition is to comply with SLSA specifications. Random scrutineering of equipment will occur during the 3 Rounds of the SSTL.

## EVENT CONDITIONS

The general competitive conditions as detailed in the current edition of the SSM and any subsequent Bulletins shall apply to the conduct of these events except where amended by these rules.

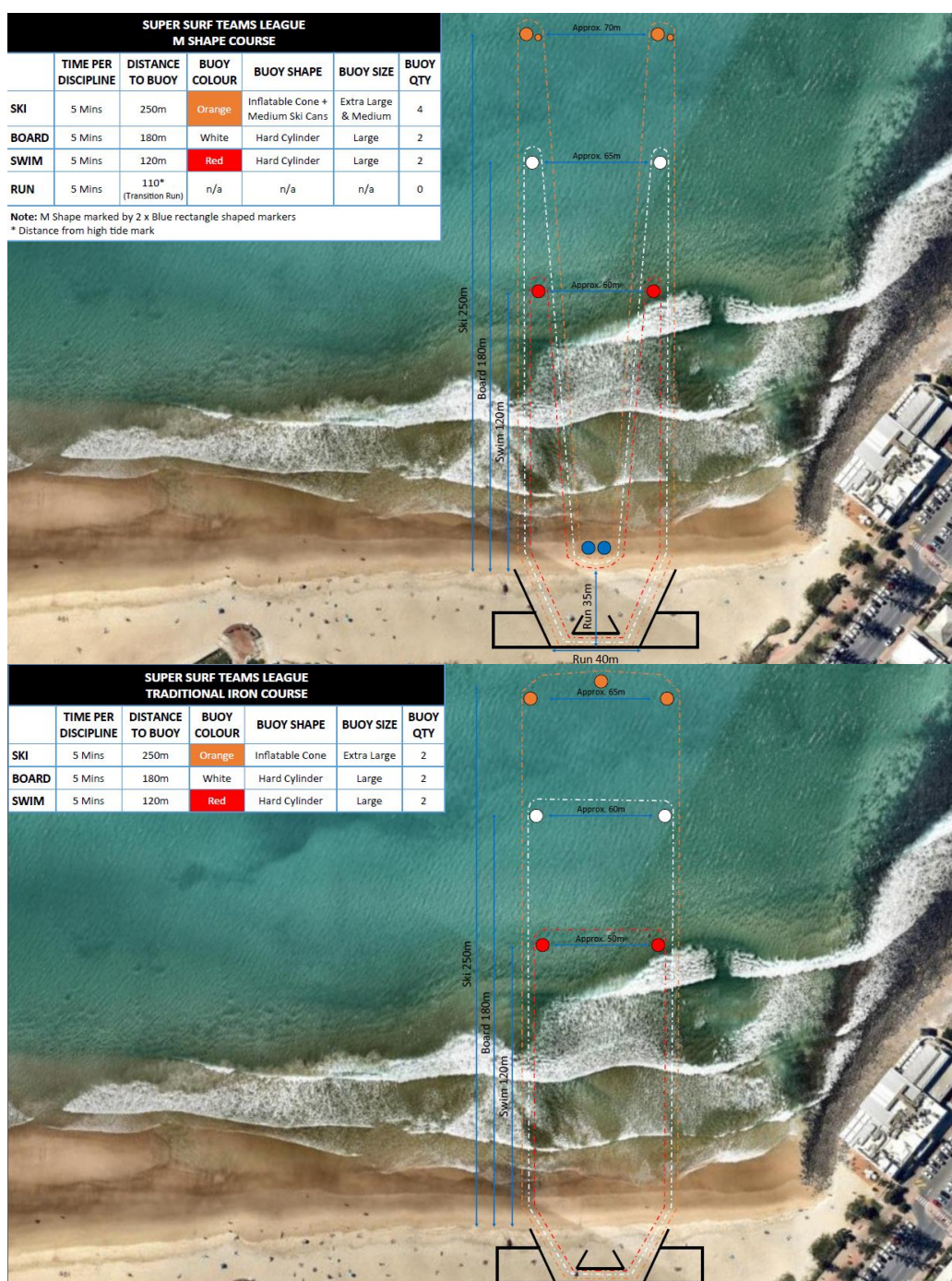
All events where possible and, conditions permitting, shall be conducted as finals – except Beach Sprint and Flags which will be conducted with heats and finals.

Each Team will field only one (1) competitor or team per event.

The primary amendments are:

### a) Water Courses:

Water events will be conducted around the buoy courses, and distances, set for the Nutri Grain Ironman/Woman Round.



**b) Water Event Starts:**

Unless otherwise advised, all water events shall be started on the beach approximately 15 metres from the water's edge (run start). Craft will be placed in front of the start line and as close as practicable to the water's edge. Handlers are not required for the start of events except for the Ski events where at the Competition Committees discretion handlers may be utilised to hold the craft in the water to avoid the dragging/carrying of skis into the water.

**c) Water Event Finishes:**

Unless otherwise advised, all water event shall finish as per the Ironperson races (run finish). Craft and paddles may be abandoned after rounding the last turning buoy of the swim course. Handlers are to be used to remove craft and paddles from the course.

**d) Change Over Area and Tagging for Relay Style Events:**

In all relay style events the Referee will designate a Changeover Area that will commence 5m before the finish arch (southern side) and finish at the arch. The incoming athlete will run from the waters edge around the southern turning flag towards the finish arch. In the Changeover Area a tag must take place between the incoming competitor and the outgoing competitor. The tag can take place on any part of the body. Any breach of the Changeover Rule may result in disqualification.

**e) M Shape Mixed Ocean M Life Saver Relay :**

Fixed order of run, swim, board ski. To be run as per the rules outlined in the 36<sup>th</sup> Edition of the SSM. M shape may be amended to a traditional course if broadcast time restraints dictate.

**f) Entry Condition:**

If a Member has been injured & processed through iCare (WorkCover Authority New South Wales) & wishes to compete in a SLSA Competition or returning to SLSA Surf Patrol Duties etc, then they MUST complete & submit a Return to Surf Duties Form BEFORE returning to ensure full medical clearance.

**Note 1:** Refer to SLSA Policy 5.4 "Proficiency and Patrol Hour Requirements for Competition Eligibility". All selected competitors must be proficient to the relative SLSA Award for their age group and, as appropriate, have satisfied the patrol requirements as specified by their Clubs. Competitors and Team Management must also be current financial members of their respective surf club.

## TEAMS

**SSTL Team composition.**










A SSTL Team (8) will consist of the following:

- 4 x male competitors
- 4 x female competitors
- All competitors must be proficient and eligible to compete in the Open category for the 2019/20 season (i.e. U17, U19 or Open).
- Competitors competing in the U15 age group for the 2019/20 Season are not permitted to compete.
- Teams composition may vary from round to round.

**Handlers**

Each Team is permitted one handler to assist with craft. Handlers must wear a Team competition cap and will be provided one high visibility yellow SLSA handler bib.

## DRAWS AND BALLOTS

Prior to the event The Competition Committee will undertake a draw positioning for each event. Initial draws will be undertaken for the first event conducted in each of the water area and beach area of competition. Subsequent draws will be of the 'rolling draw' format where all Teams will move sideways one beach position in each event conducted in the area.

After the first run through of the beach flags event in each division, separate draws are to be undertaken in each age division for lane positions for all subsequent run throughs.

### POINTS SCORE

Within each Round all races will be allocated points on a 13 to 1 basis i.e. 1<sup>st</sup> - 13 points, 2<sup>nd</sup> - 12 points down to 13<sup>th</sup> – 1 point. A separate and cumulative point score will be kept for each Round.

If a competitor or a team fails to start, fails to finish or is disqualified in a race – they will receive NIL points for that race.



At the conclusion of each Round all Teams will then be ranked from 13 to 1 based on the aggregate point score for that Round. The Team with the highest ranking will then be awarded 13 points, 2<sup>nd</sup> – 12 points down to 13<sup>th</sup> – 1 point for the Round.

### **Overall Point Score**

The Team with the highest point score at the conclusion of Round 3 shall be declared the winner. Further to this if there is a tied point score, the team with the most 1st placings shall be declared the winner. Failing this, the Team with the most 2nd placings to the last placing points awarded respectively will be considered to determine a winner. If, after this procedure there is no single winner, then the point score will be declared a tie and dual trophies will be presented.

### **PRESENTATIONS**

Teams will be competing for the SSTL Trophy. Medals will also be awarded to 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> in the overall final point score.

### **PROTESTS**

All protests shall be lodged with the Referee or Deputy Referee in accordance with the procedures set down in the SSM and any subsequent bulletins and shall identify the specific sections/clauses in the Competition Manual and or event rules upon which the protest is based.

Protest Forms will be available from the administration centre. An “Appeals Fee” of \$115.00 (incl GST) must accompany all protest appeals when submitted to the Appeals Committee for adjudication. If the appeal is upheld, then the Appeals Fee will be fully refunded.

Each team is allowed to make no more than three (3) unsuccessful appeals. Once all three unsuccessful appeals have been used a team can no longer lodge an appeal on a decision.

### **INJURY/ILLNESS/ TEAM SUBSTITUTION**

A Team may replace an athlete in their team up until the commencement of the first race of each Round.

After competition commences in each Round a Team cannot make a replacement from outside of their Team. This includes States that have multiple Teams – substitutions can not be made between Teams.

### **SLSA CODE OF BEHAVIOUR**

SLSA expects that all members involved in SSTL will co-operate to ensure a positive public image and to participate in a spirit of goodwill and sportsmanship.

The SLSA Code of Conduct, Competing Unfairly and Abuse/Inappropriate clauses etc. are contained in the current edition of the [SLSA Surf Sports Manual](#) (Sport > Surf Sports Manual) and any subsequent Bulletins.

Any incidents or behaviour likely to cause embarrassment or damage to the reputation and/or image of lifesaving competition will be managed as prescribed in the current edition of SLSA’s Rules, Surf Sports Manual and any subsequent Bulletins.

### **MEDIA STATEMENTS**

Teams shall be permitted to promote the event and or their State/Territory team within their own state. However, no competitor, Team Manager, official or spokesperson for a team, shall make media

statements that could bring the SSTL, its sponsor, or officials, into controversy. Such statements shall be deemed to be a breach of SLSA discipline and may be dealt with accordingly.

Complaints regarding the organisation of the SSTL, or any other matters, should be directed through the appropriate SLSA channels and will be dealt with by the responsible section, or officers. Such official complaints will be acknowledged.

## **THEFT**

Any person/s found stealing signage or any equipment owned by Surf Life Saving Australia, the hosting authority, states or another individual may be immediately reported to the police and that person/s be brought before a SLSA Disciplinary Committee.

Please note that automatic disqualification of the team from the SSTL may occur if any member is found guilty of theft.

## **SLSA ANTI-DOPING POLICY**

Surf Life Saving Australia supports the Australian Government, SportAus, the AOC, and the Australian Sports Anti-Doping Authority (ASADA) in their efforts to eradicate the use of drugs in sport. SLSA has published an anti-doping policy, which will be adhered to for this event.

Please be aware that random drug testing by ASADA could take place during the SSTL. It is highly recommended each State/Territory team member (including management and staff) complete the ASADA online e-learning program (Level 1) to ensure all personnel are aware of contemporary issues pertaining to anti-doping.
