Background

The Australian Lifesaving Boat Emergency Rescue Training (ALBERT) originated in Cudgen Headland SLSC on the Far North Coast (FNC) Branch and delivers inflatable rescue boat (IRB) training.

Surf Life Saving New South Wales (SLSNSW) is the peak water safety, drowning prevention and rescue organisation in NSW and one of the largest volunteer-based community service organisations in Australia. With over 76,000 members, the organisation encompasses a range of diverse activities including lifesaving services, community education, surf sports, member development and training, all of which contribute to the primary purpose to save lives and meet a target of zero preventable deaths and injuries on NSW beaches.

In December 2018 Surf Life Saving NSW was gazetted as an Emergency Service Organisation. As a result of this the skills and capabilities of our frontline lifesavers become all the more important. The ALBERT program is positioned to play a valuable role in upskilling our lifesavers by focusing on best practice and consistency in the delivery of training programs.

The ALBERT program enhances the skills and experiences of lifesavers through collaborative and consistent training, utilising a mix of drill-based activities, dedicated coaching and scenario-based training. ALBERT is also an important vehicle to support networking and knowledge sharing between members, Clubs and Branches across the state.

The Role

The ALBERT State Steering Committee is looking for suitably qualified IRB Operators to assist with development of the ALBERT training content which will be delivered throughout the state.

Reporting to the Training SME on the ALBERT Steering Committee and working in conjunction with the coaching and training sub-committee, these positions will require development of content in-line with the strategic direction of the ALBERT Program
