Australian Life Saving Team

SLSA National Coaching Program

Development Coach

The development coach course has now been completely redesigned and released onto the Learning Management System. The course is now streamlined with the electives and should provide participants with a much easier progression.

Sweep Accreditation

Recently the ASRL released a facebook post eluding to the Sweep Accreditation Process.

To clarify:

- All beginner sweeps must be entered into SurfGuard as an S1 Sweep. An S1 Sweep cannot race. It is the clubs responsibility to enter the sweep into SurfGuard.
- An S2 sweep must be entered into SurfGuard and must have enrolled or completed the Development Coach course or pre-2017, Level 1 or 2 Surf Coach award. An S2 Sweep cannot compete in an event with a Surf Hazard above SH13.
- An S3 sweep must be entered into SurfGuard and must have completed the Development Coach course or pre-2017, Level 1 or 2 Surfcoach award.

No other sweep award will be acknowledged in SEMS.

Sweep Re-Accreditation

All Level 1, 2, 3 Coaching awards will expire in December 2018. It is the coaches responsibility to re-accredit. Re-accreditation can be completed by completing the form found on the members area. If a sweep held a Level 1 or 2 Coaching award, they may re-accredit as a Development Coach. As Level 3 Coach may re-accredit as a Performance Coach.

Re-accreditation is free of charge.

ASADA Level 1 Anti-Doping course is now a prerequisite for Development Coach, as is ASADA Level 2 Anti-Doping course for Performance Coach. Each course has now been set up in SurfGuard and can be entered by administrators at Club/Branch/State level.

Aussies Discipline Review and Event Changes

From the 2016 Sports Management and Advisory Workshop Meeting, a national working group was formed to review all event disciplines carried out annually at 'The Aussies.' With growing pressure on timetables and fluctuating participation levels, Sport Advisors implored SLSA to analyse the appropriateness and relevance of disciplines to ensure these meet member and organisational demands.

Prior to the Discipline Review Report being presented in May 2018 to the Sports Management and Advisory Workshop, the national working group communicated findings to states, branches, clubs and event discipline panels for further consultation. The recommendations from the Discipline Review Report were supported by all members of the 2018 Sport Management and Advisory Workshop.

Following endorsement from the SLSA board the following changes will be made to the Aussies for the 2018/2019 and 2019/2020 season.
