Subject:	Grant Opportunity – Australia Day 2022 Community Grants (closing 19/11)

The National Australia Day Council (NADC) is offering grants to assist community organisations to deliver fun and COVID safe Australia Day events. Events can be a new or existing public event or activity, a community activity, or an online engagement.

IMPORTANT: Events/activities funded under these grants MUST proceed in a COVID safe environment regardless of last minute changes to COVID public health restrictions.

- <u>Funding may be used toward running a face-to-face event AND associated costs for planning an alternative 'Plan B' celebration</u>. Applicants applying for funding for a face-to-face event are to plan a virtual alternative ('Plan B celebration') that enables them still deliver the event regardless of last minute changes to COVID restrictions.
- All costs incurred for either event (Plan A and Plan B) will be eligible provided one or the other event is held.
- If neither event proceeds, the applicant must repay any grant funds received.
- <u>Between \$10,000 \$20,000</u> (ex GST) events must proceed in keeping with COVID health directions, even if last minute changes to COVID restrictions, i.e. events must proceed as a virtual event rather than in person event.
- <u>Up to an additional \$10,000</u> (ex GST) where the event includes strong recognition of Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander peoples.
- The theme of Australia Day 2022 is 'Reflect. Respect. Celebrate. We're all part of the story'.

Key points to note:

- Applicants are encouraged to
 - work together with local Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander communities to create events that are meaningful, reflective, and respectful;
 - o support local businesses and communities through the planning and execution of the event.
- The funding body has created branding and design assets for Australia Day 2022. Successful applicants will be required to promote this message through this collateral.
- Successful applicants will be required to list their event(s) on the NADC's Australia Day Event Register website.
- Examples of eligible costs include but are not limited to:
 - o planning, preparing for and running Virtual Events (including Plan B events);
 - o delivery costs for sending Promotional Merchandise to awards to attendees / recipients;
 - o face-to-face event costs, e.g. catering; promotional material/merchandise; artist/talent fees; venue fees; equipment hire; public safety costs such as cleaning supplies, COVID marshals, PPE etc.
- <u>Eligible activities include any public event and alternative virtual event</u> that will take place on Australia Day 2022 such as fireworks; live entertainment; family friendly events; flag raising ceremonies; food and BBQ; sporting events; community events and/or online engagement.
