Significant Service Award (President's Medal)

"... <u>significant</u> and <u>outstanding</u> voluntary service ...20 years"

The point of distinction to this recognition award is the sustained high level of outstanding service over at least 20 years that <u>has made</u> significant contribution to Surf Life Saving in Australia. A recipient of the Significant Service Award (President's Medal)...

- Has made a significant contribution to the advancement of Surf Life Saving in Australia.
- Has sustained a high level of service that places them in a group of members who have exemplified sustained outstanding practice to maintain SLSA's advancement and development
- Is an exemplary model of commitment, good practice and a sustained level of high performance
- Has evidenced this level of service at any level of SLSA provided that the service demonstrates a sustained contribution to model best practice within SLSA
- This award may be awarded on the basis of a member's service over a career in SLS, but may also be awarded to members who have demonstrated significant and outstanding service, but who have, as yet, not reached the level of distinguished service required for Life membership.
- Will be of good standing and well respected.

Key questions to be applied at this level include ...

- What makes this person's service significant within SLSA?
- What has been the sustained nature of this significant service?
- What has been the significant contribution made through this service?

In addition, members who have contributed to significant international projects and/ or events or to national projects with international significance should also be nominated for ILS Citations. This includes capacity building programs with developing nations, educational tours, the conduct of sporting events and Sponsors, Donors, Politicians that have made significant contribution to the growth and sustainability of SLSA.
