Summary:	This Circular contains the relevant information to support selection of the Australian Life Saving Team for the 2024 Lifesaving World Championships in August 2024 and also the <a href="#">Team Expressions of Interest Link</a> which should be completed before <b>11:59pm on 29<sup>th</sup> Feb, 2024.</b>

## SUMMARY

The Australian Life Saving Team is still enjoying the success from the clean sweep of the point score from Pool and Ocean events at the 2022 Lifesaving World Championships in Riccione, Italy.

The 2024 Lifesaving World Championships will be held at home this year on the Gold Coast and is sure to be a fantastic celebration of Surf Life Saving whilst showcasing to the world, the breadth and depth of talent here in Australia.

An Open, Youth and IRB team will be selected to represent Australia to compete in the National Teams Program which will be held from 28<sup>th</sup> August – 1<sup>st</sup> September and 4<sup>th</sup> September for the IRB competition. A Circular will soon follow to outline the IRB Team Selection process.

Australian team members will compete as the Australian Life Saving Team which is a shared venture with Royal Life Saving Australia.

It is important that members are aware of the unique process undertaken to select the 12 x Open and 12 x Youth Team members due to the varied skill set required to compete across Pool, Ocean, and Beach events.

## ELIGIBILITY

Team eligibility is outlined in detail in the [Selection Guidelines](#).

In addition to other listed eligibility requirements, age eligibility is defined below.

Youth Team: Competitors who turn 15,16,17 or 18 years of age on or before 31/12/2024.

Open Team: Competitors who turn 16 years of age on or before 31/12/2024. There is no maximum age.

## TEAM COMPOSITION / SIZE

### Open Team

The Open Team comprises of 12 athletes.

The Youth Team comprises of 12 athletes.

Each team must contest events on the beach, in the ocean and in the pool. For athletes to increase their chances of selection, it is advisable that they provide selectors with an opportunity to review performances and results across multiple disciplines (beach, ocean, and pool) where possible.

Considering the Worlds Program, it is essential to select athletes who can perform across multiple disciplines i.e. an ocean athlete to perform in pool relays or a pool athlete to perform in a beach relay or ocean event etc.

### NATIONAL TEAMS POINT SCORE

The number of points on offer at the beach and in the pool are equal i.e. a line throw attracts the same number of points as an oceanman (iron) event.

Athletes are required to compete at a minimum of heats and finals (depending on events) and each event is scored in the following way.

The winning nation comprises the most points at the end of both ocean and pool competition.

### Team Announcement

The Australian Life Saving Team preliminarily selected to represent Australia in the National Teams competition will be announced on the final day of competition at the 2023/2024 SLSA Australian Surf Life Saving Championships at Maroochydore on 21<sup>st</sup> April 2024.

All athletes who are vying for team selection should where possible aim to be present at this announcement.

### Selection Panel and Collaborative Panel

The collaborative Panel is made up of SLSA and RLSSA Operational Staff Members. The role of this panel is to provide governance to the appointment and selection process. They also appoint the Selection Panel which is made up of a convenor along with two panel members. SLSA and RLSSA are represented on this panel.

The Head Coach will sit with the Selection Panel in an advisory role.

### Team Camps and Availability

For those successful with team selection. Camps have been planned as part of the Worlds preparations and all team members are required to attend (*unless approval has been sought in advance from the Head Coach or SLSA High Performance and Pathways Manager*).
